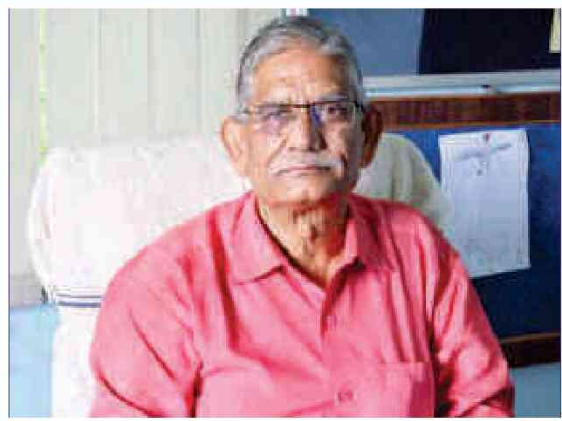

## The Secretary's Note

**W**e feel proud of completing 52 successful years in the Rural Development Sector in Jharkhand & Bihar, with significant growth in programs and number of people we served, every year.

In the reporting year NBJK also got two national prestigious awards, 1. Role Model NGO working on the issue of Disability outside CHAI network in the country and 2. Social Impact Award 2022. NBJK, being dedicated to enhancing the lives of over 40,000 persons with disabilities in Jharkhand and Bihar for more than two decades, it has been honored with the Mary Glowrey-Liliane Brekelmans Disability Award 2022, with Rupees Two Lakh award money, presented by the Catholic Health Association of India (CHAI)-Hyderabad and Liliane Foundation-The Netherlands. NBJK also honored as "First runner-up" of Bridgestone Mobility Social Impact Award 2022, including a citation, trophy and Rs. 10 lakh award money. We received this award for our outstanding work in restoring eyesight to rural poor suffering from avoidable blindness and improving their mobility in activities of daily living, access to education and livelihood opportunities.

The new initiatives of the year have been (1) A computer center for visually impaired children & youths, that provides a free & certified computer training course and supports them in leading productive independent lives. (2) We developed smart classes in 8 government schools and developed 16 Anganwadi centers as model centers that enabled 2500 rural children to access online education in a joyful way. (3) SBI Sanjeevani Clinic on Wheels equipped with advanced diagnostic instruments and a competent medical team has played a crucial role to improve health facility in Gaya district. We went at 590 distant villages and organized 1246 outreach health camps with 21,248 OPD & free medication in Hazaribagh district. (4) Community Based Inclusive Development (CBID) of 5000 Person with Disability (PwDs) in 20 slums/rural areas of Patna, targeting to link 508 PwDs with sustainable livelihood, UDID card to 2000 PwDs, made aware 2000 children of schools on disability issues, assistive devices to 400 PwDs, mental health support to 300 persons with mental illness, organizing 21 DPOs with 100 SHGs of PwDs, 275 home based rehabilitation services etc. (5) In Chanho block of Ranchi district, we promoted another FPO by farmers while an earlier women-FPO at Khunti district performing well with annual business of more than Rs. 03 crore in the reporting year. (6) NBJK extended its RCC program in Maharashtra too in Raigad district, running 20 centres in Karjat and Khalapur tehsils, improving academic performance of about 800 girls of high schools.

We also want to inform that as usual the success of students in Remedial Coaching Centers and Schools has been extraordinary, with 84% students secured 1st division, in eye health services 166491 people provided medical consultation in OPD in our 4 eye hospitals and we did 25647 cataract surgeries, the number of farmers getting annual income over Rs. 01 lakh becomes 6510.

Despite all these achievements, NBJK lost two very closely associated persons in the year 2022. Mrs. Ine Burna-le Blanc from The Netherlands has left this world on 25 June 2022. She supported us to initiate and continue Lord Buddha Home for Children since 2005. Also Mr. Philman Baxla, the secretary of Lok Prerna Kendra, Simariya, Chatra is no more. He breathed his last on 16 November 2022 due to brain hemorrhage. Mr. Baxla, a dedicated social worker promoted by NBJK since his youth and he was working well among marginalized communities. We pay our rich tribute to Mrs. Blanc and Mr. Baxla!!

We also are happy to inform about our two second line competent & qualified leaders to NBJK, Anand & Gaurav, showing their potentials and creativity, in taking over the values, mission, vision, work culture of transparency & honesty with sincerity and successfully carrying forward all the activities with desired impact.

Here I take this opportunity to express sincere gratitude to all the donors, supporters, friends, staffs and most importantly the people of Jharkhand & Bihar for granting us the chance to deliver our services.

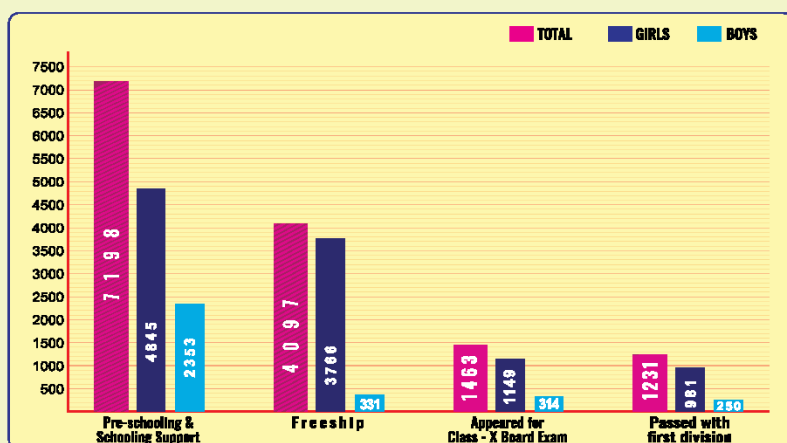

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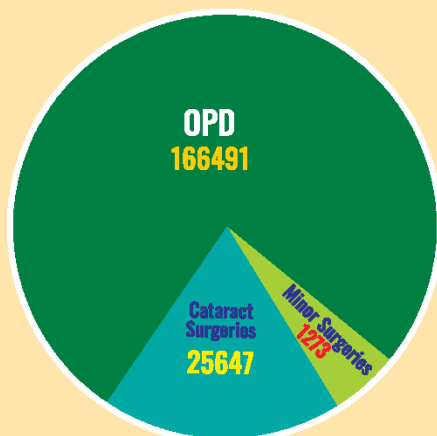
# ANNUAL HIGHLIGHTS

- Play-way education, CBSE syllabus, Co-curricular activities including sports, gardening, song & dance-drama, exposure visits, most comfortable & unique school in the panchayat.
- Visit of Mr. Rattesh Gumber & family from IT Alliance, Australia, they provided 08 nos. Metal Benches for the school ground.

- 163 students (72 girls, 91 boys) appeared for class X board exam by JAC, 147 (65 girls, 82 boys) passed with first division and 16 (07 girls, 09 boys) achieved second division. 100% result, 90% first division.
- Satish Kumar Yadav (92%) as school topper, followed by Abhishek Kumar Pandey (88%) and Pooja Chakran (85%).

#### 04. Chandrakala Devi Daga High School

- At village-Kewalia, block-Chouparan, district-Hazaribagh, Coverage of 20 villages likes Kewalia, Karma, Darjichak, Iguniya, Machla, Kedli, Ambajit, Bara, Jokat etc.
- Classes from VI to X, total enrollment-342 (217 girls, 125 boys), Sponsorship/Free-ship to all 217 girl children as through NBJK (22), GiveIndia (102), Online Danamojo (80), Online Individual (13) and Free-ship to 15 boys through NBJK.
- 50 students (24 girls, 26 boys) have appeared for class VIII board exam, 45 came out with Grade A+, 54 students (31 girls, 23 boys) achieved Grade A+ & A out of 89 students (54 girls, 35 boys) passed class IX board exam.
- 118 students (78 girls, 40 boys) appeared in class X board exam, 111 (72 girls, 39 boys) passed with 1st division and 07 (06 girls, 01 boy) achieved 2nd division.

- A harbinger for girls' education in the area, poor villagers send their daughters to the school and they are doing well.

#### 05. Surekha Prakash Bhai Public School Support: Local Community

- At village Bahera in Chouparan block of Hazaribagh district, coverage of 250 villages in Chouparan, Itkhori, Mayurbhanj blocks of Hazaribagh & Chatra districts.
- Life-size premises, all required facilities, CBSE affiliation, Nursery-XII classes, excellent education with all-round activities.
- Caters 1596 students (girls-525, boys-1071) and 168 (girls-66, boys-102) avail free-ship, scholarship or fees relaxation.
- For class XII board exam, 68 children appeared and 48 got first division, Aarav Raj emerged as the topper with 92% marks, overall result of the school is 96%.
- 98% result in class X board exam, 105 out of 174 students secured first division, Sweetie Gupta & Sanni Kumar shared the top position with 94% marks for each.
- Three students – Navneet Kumar (class IX), Riya Kumari (class VIII) and Nisha Kumari (class VIII) have qualified for National Gatka (Boys & Girls) Championship-2022 in Delhi & Bhatinda (Punjab), achieved Third Position.
- Mr. Rattesh Gumber (Founder, IT Alliance-Australia) visited Science Exhibition at the school and praised the students for their creativity.

#### 06. Birsa Public School Support: Local Community, NBJK & Action Village India-UK

- At village-Devkuli, block-Ichak, district-Hazaribagh, coverage of 08 nearby villages, prefers girls to complete their schooling.
- Co-education, classes from Nursery to X, total strength-178 (116 girls, 62 boys), AVI sponsors 95 girl children to complete their school education.
- Extra-curricular activities, big campus, drinking water, toilets, regular classes, good result.
- Total 22 girl students appeared for class X board exam conducted by Jharkhand Academic Council, Ranchi, 20 have obtained first division while 02 could achieve second division. 100% result, 91% came out with first division.
- Fulfillment of learning materials & other requirements to the girl children on time. Sonali Kumari (d/o-Mr. Puroshottam Pandey, village-Devkuli) is the top scorer with 82% marks.



## 07. Roshni Dhruva High School **Support: Local Community, NBJK, Smt. Roshni & Shri Dhruva Shah, Prakash Bhai-Ahmedabad**

- At village-Nagri, block-Churchu, district-Hazaribagh, Coverage of 36 villages in Churchu, Daru blocks of Hazaribagh district and in Mandu block of Ramgarh district.
- Co-education, classes from VI to X, total enrollment-225 (90 girls, 135 boys), fees relaxation to 20 students (10 girls, 10 boys) belong to poor families.
- Visits by Mr. Girija Satish (President, NBJK), Mr. Gandharv Gaurav (Programme Director, NBJK) and Mr. Rajeew Kumar Singh (Sr. Prog. Manager, NBJK), issues like quality education: discipline and better future of children have been discussed.
- Digital classrooms, trained teachers, playground, science lab & other facilities make the school different from other existing schools in the area.
- In class X board exam by Jharkhand Academic Council, total 49 students (21 girls, 28 boys) appeared, 42 (18 girls, 24 boys) resulted with first division and 07 (03 girls, 04 boys) with second division, 100% result, 86% achieved first division.
- On Annual Sports Competition for Girls, events held like 100 Meters Race, Kabaddi, Speech & Music competitions. All the winners were awarded with books, shields and medals.
- School girls have tied Rakhi on the wrists of police personnel at nearby Churchu police station as well as CRPF camp. Mr. Indradev Rajwar (Officer In-charge, Churchu PS) and Mr. Manoj Kumar Singh (DSP, CRPF) have greeted their small sisters.



## 08. Komal Pujan Public School

**Support: J.J. Visser-The Netherlands, Local Community, NBJK, Prakash Bhai Shah & Bhavin Bhai Shah-Ahmedabad**

- At village-Silaunja near Bodhgaya in Gaya district of Bihar, Coverage of 34 villages in Bodhgaya, Mohanpur and Fatehpur blocks of Gaya district.
- Classes from Nursery to X, Total strength-520 (200 girls, 320 boys), CBSE pattern, English medium, ICT mode of teaching, computer education, smart classes.
- Residential, co-education, co-curricular activities, counseling facility, sports & music, auditorium, playground & special teachers.
- Free-ship to 10 students (05 girls, 05 boys), Fees relaxation to 10 students (06 girls, 04 boys).
- Among 10 students (girls-04, boys-06) appeared for class X board exam, 04 (girls-02, boys-02) bagged first division and 06 (02 girls, boys-04) got second division. In class XII board exam, 05 (girls-02, boys-03) students appeared and 02 (both boys) clicked first division while 03 (girls-02, boy-01) have passed with second division.
- Showcasing students' versatile talent in singing, dancing, drawing, painting, writing etc. during various events & occasions.
- Japanese football coach Mr. Nojomo Hadihara & his friends have provided training to the students on every Sunday at the school campus.



## 09. Girls' Education & Remedial Coaching Centers

**Support: Action Village India, U. K.**



- Focuses upon completion of secondary school education for marginalized girls in villages by sponsoring their school fees, dress, books-notebooks, extra tuition etc.
- Addresses issues like gender disparity, child marriage and resource crisis among poor families those hinder girls' empowerment.
- Covered 1110 girl children (sponsored - 435, at RCCs - 675) from 07 blocks in Hazaribagh, Chatra, Dumka, Ranchi and Gaya districts of Jharkhand and Bihar states.
- 363 girls appeared for class X board exam, 94% result, 244 (67%) passed with first division, 91 (25%) obtained second division and 28 (8%) had either third division / marginal / pending result or they couldn't join the exam.
- 17 Remedial Coaching Centers (RCCs) at villages in Sadar, Katkamsandi and Katkamdag blocks of Hazaribagh district, enrolled 675 girl children of class VIII, IX & X, provided those free coaching classes for Science, Math and English.
- 230 girls from RCCs have appeared for class X board exam, 99% result, 184 secured 1st division, 42 got 2nd division, 02 passed with 3rd division and 02 counted for pending/marginal results.
- RCCs offers amicable milieu for teachers & students through orientation training to teachers, their monthly review meetings, monthly test & extra-curricular activities for students, parents-teacher meetings and so on to ensure improved output.

## CASE STORY Riya Raj: The Girl on the Top

**M**eeet Riya Raj, the girl child from village-Pabra, block-Katkamsandi, district-Hazaribagh (Jharkhand) and a regular student of her village based Remedial Coaching Centre. This RCC is one among 17 such centres as a part of the Girls' Education Programme at villages in Katkamsandi, Katkamdag and Sadar blocks of the district by NBJK with support of Action Village India.

Riya Raj is the topper among 230 girl children from all RCCs appeared for class X board exam conducted by Jharkhand Academic Council, Ranchi and scored 94% marks.

"In class IX, I have joined the RCC and at that time I was quite weak in Maths, Science & English. But by attending my classes regularly and following the teacher's instructions, I have focused upon these three subjects primarily", Riya says and shares further that how she could obtain Grade a+ in all subjects during class IX with daily 2 hours' study that increased up to 5 hours per day in class X.

Riya Raj wants to be an engineer. Her father Mr. Chandan Kumar runs a small grocery shop in his village and mother Mrs. Reena Kumari is a housewife. Riya's parents are very happy over her result and show determination to educate their daughter. They praise the very idea of RCC for valuable contribution to girls' education in villages.

Its noteworthy that 80% girl children from these RCCs have secured first division in Class X Board Exam and five girls from RCC-Pabra could achieve 90% or above marks. Md. Farukh, the teacher gets much appreciation for this successful performance of the centre.



### 10. Remedial Coaching Centers

Support: UTI Mutual Fund, Mumbai

- To enhance academic performance of school girls of class VIII, IX & X in villages through regular extra free tuition upon comparatively tough subjects like Math, English & Science.
- Coverage of around 100 villages with 30 Remedial Coaching Centres, enrollment of 1020 students (girls-928, boys-92) from remote rural areas of Sadar, Daru and Churchu blocks in Hazaribagh district.
- Each RCC facilitated with a competent teacher responsible for organizing 2.5 hours pre / post school classes and monthly test for students.
- Parents-teacher meeting, subject wise quiz competition-exposure visit-motivational input for students and periodical training to teachers.
- Total 297 students appeared for class X board exam, 235 achieved first division, 58 got second division and only 04 had marginal or pending result.

### 11. Remedial Coaching Centre

Support: SBI General Insurance- Mumbai

- Ensuring quality education to 1200 marginalized & poor rural girls studying in village-based government & government aided Hindi /Marathi medium high schools in villages of Maharashtra & Jharkhand
- Identification and selection of 20 schools in Karjat & Khalapur Tehsil of Raigad district in Maharashtra and 10 Schools in Chauparan block of Hazaribagh district in Jharkhand.
- 1200 girls' students of high schools class 8th, 9th and 10th (about 8% boys).
- Remedial learning classes in English, Math and Science. Regular monthly test and assessment of progress of each student. Meeting with parents.
- Impact: 99% results in 10th board exam of RCCs' students with about 70% girls scoring 1st division and continuing their education after 10th. No marriage of any girl of RCC reported.
- Visit by Mr. Clifford D'Costa (SBI General Insurance CSR Manager), Mr. Clifford and Team member Ms. Rasagna Kalaspati visited running RCCs in the field at Raigad on 23rd Nov 2022 & 31 Jan 2023 & Hazaribagh on 7th Feb 2023.





## 12. Lord Buddha Home for Children

Support: Stichting Kinderhulp Bodhgaya-The Netherlands, GiveIndia, Goonj - New Delhi/Bihar, Kiran Bhai Shah-Ahmedabad, Shamdasani Foundation-Hong Kong and Online Individual Donors



- A place of safety for needy children at village-Silaunja near Bodhgaya (Gaya, Bihar) to provide them quality food, cloth & education free of cost.
- Takes responsibility of total 57 children (33 girls & 24 boys) out of which 22 (07 girls & 15 boys) live in campus and enrolled in NBJK run Komal Pujan Public School in the same premises.

## 13. Child Reporters

- An initiative to enable such youngsters with all required proficiency with tools & techniques on computer, spoken English, health & hygiene, mobility etc to lead productive independent lives.
- Enrollment of 12 students in two batches, training completed for 06, a group of visually challenged girls have been shortlisted for next batches.
- Specially designed 06 months course with practical learning upon basics of computer, its applications, keyboard orientation, NonVisual Desktop Access, Hardware, Software, Internet, and Typing etc.



## Case Story From Darkness to Digital

Vishal Kumar, a tenacious 20-year-old hailing from Murarpur village in Gaya's Chandauti block, has embarked on an extraordinary journey that defies the odds and inspires all who cross his path. Born with a significant visual impairment, Vishal's life has been marked by resilience and an unwavering pursuit of knowledge, with only 30% of his eyesight intact.

Vishal's parents, Shri Sanjay Prasad and Smt. Sangita Devi, instilled in him the values of perseverance and education, and he successfully graduated from Gaya College, a testament to his indomitable spirit.

However, it was a twist of fate that truly transformed Vishal's life when Tanya Computer Center discovered him. Undaunted by his lack of prior computer knowledge, Vishal joined the institute fueled by curiosity and determination. He declared, "I never imagined that a semi-blind person like me could gain knowledge of such things."

Through his journey in computer classes, Vishal's intelligence and unwavering focus ensured rapid progress. He mastered the fundamentals of computers, excelling in keyboard operations, typing, basic software handling, and even delving into Excel sheets and NVDA setup.

With unshakable confidence, Vishal envisions a future where, within six months of training, he will navigate the digital realm with ease. His newfound skill promises to open new avenues in his life, proving that Vishal Kumar is not just a survivor but a beacon of inspiration, showing that one's dreams can be achieved, regardless of the challenges life presents.

## CASE STORY Needle-in-Retina: A Remarkable Recovery

In a significant surgical feat on May 31, 2022, at LNJEH-Hazaribagh, a tailoring needle fragment, measuring 8 mm in length, was successfully removed from the left eye of Md. Gufran, son of Saitar Miyan from Nawadih, Gaya. Astonishingly, this metallic intruder had resided within his eye for a staggering four years.

Gufran, a skilled tailor, recounted the fateful incident when a needle fragment swiftly penetrated his eye, leaving behind a persistent pricking sensation. Despite seeking various treatments, his pain endured, until he sought refuge at LNJEH. Here, Dr. (Ms.) Archana Kumari and her dedicated team diagnosed the presence of the foreign body within his retina.

Dr. Archana, who performed the life-changing surgery, emphasized the importance of timely intervention. She stated that the gradual decline in Mr. Gufran's vision could have led to irreparable eye damage if the needle had not been removed promptly.

Post-surgery, Mr. Gufran expressed his profound gratitude, acknowledging that the medical team at LNJEH had not only restored his vision but also safeguarded his livelihood and the well-being of his dependent family members.

## CASE STORY

### Reviving Lives on Wheels

About 50 years old Shri Ramji Prasad lives at Barki Basadhi village of Bodhgaya block. He is a farmer with modest means. He was suffering from general weakness and skin problems.

When SBI Sanjeevani Clinic on Wheels rolled into his village, he met Dr. Syed Faizan Amin, the physician and explained his problems. The physician delved into Ramji Prasad's health concerns, conducting a comprehensive examination that included vital tests for Blood Pressure, Blood Sedimentation Rate, Blood Sugar Profile, and overall health indicators. The diagnosis revealed that Ramji Prasad was grappling with Diabetes (Type I) and Tinea pedis (commonly known as Athlete's foot).

Ramji Prasad received the necessary medications and was provided guidance on a controlled diet plan, coupled with the promise of monthly check-ups when the

medical van returned to the village. After two months of dedicated treatment, his sugar level declined from a staggering 374 mg/dL to a manageable 147 mg/dL, and the fungal infection receded.

Filled with gratitude, Ramji Prasad now credits the transformative impact of the SBI Sanjeevani Clinic on Wheels, a ground-breaking initiative by NBJK and SBI Foundation, for rejuvenating his life. He rejoices in the convenience of receiving essential healthcare services right at his doorstep, a testament to the remarkable change this program has brought to his village.



## 06. Outreach General Health Camps in Villages

- To provide health services at doorstep of the poor people residing at remote rural areas and lack proper treatment due to dearth of money, trained doctors, medical personnel, diagnostic facilities and medicines.

- Medical treatment reached to 11814 patients from about 570 villages at 190 health camps.

## 07. Waste to Wealth: Solid Waste Recycling-cum-Demonstration Units (Self-Sustainable)

- Successful demonstration of value addition to wastes by their recycling as environment friendly products, promoting organic farming & packaging activities.
- Two units of Vermi-compost and Millboard from cow dung and scrap papers respectively, at village-Chakla in Ormanjhi block of Ranchi district.
- Made 800 MT Vermi-compost, being used by local farmers, nurseries, agriculture enterprises, forest department etc.
- Prepared 360 MT Green Millboard, in demand from bookbinders, sweet/shoe box makers, notebook printers, photo framers etc across many districts of Jharkhand.
- Provided skill growth & employment to 16 women-men from local villages.

- Formation of 14 Self-Help Groups of PwDs, 35 applications for Govt. pension & Ayushman Bharat entitlements are in process.
- Preparation of Individual Rehabilitation Plans for 60 Children with Disabilities under supervision of Special Educator & team, enrollment of 29 CwDs at Aanganwadis & 18 CwDs at Primary Schools, Teaching-learning materials distribution among 45 CwDs.

## CASE STORY

### A Journey from Adversity to Independence

**S**hri Pappu Kumar, a 28-year-old from a disadvantaged background in Patna, faced numerous challenges. He had polio as a child and struggled to walk properly. Despite these obstacles, Pappu had a strong desire to earn and support his family.

Through the Community Based Inclusive Development and Rehabilitation program by NBIK, supported by BAJAJ FINSERV, Pappu was identified. His dream was to have a source of income. The program team recognized his potential and connected him with a local Betel Shop, where he trained for three months, gaining valuable skills and boosting his confidence.

To further ease Pappu's life, he was provided with a modified Tricycle that served as a mobile Betel Shop. With a small financial boost from the program, Pappu started his own mobile shop. He moves around daily, serving customers and selling daily items, all with the goal of living independently and not being a burden to his family.

Pappu's shop was inaugurated by the Bajaj Finserv team, who suggested he implement a QR code-based payment system for customers, making transactions easy, safe, and modern. Pappu embraced the idea and plans to implement it soon. His story is evidence to his determination and the transformative power of support and opportunity.



## 10. Caring of Careers **Support: Carers Worldwide, U.K.**

- An initiative to improve family care service for people with disabilities, diseases, mental or geriatric problems by supporting their caretakers.

- Formation of a Farmers Producers Organization namely Chanho Birsa Munda Sangathan Producer Company Limited which runs 03 units of Solar Mobile Pump, Solar Cold Storage and Oil Expeller, provides rental facility to villagers. 425 farmers have been registered with CBMSPCL and the process is on.
- A farmers' group associated with the FPO visited Murhu Nari Shakti Kisan Producer Co. Ltd., another FPO facilitated by NBJK in Khunti district, where they learnt about Strawberry & Dragon Fruit farming.
- For Dairy development, 18 farmers have been provided good breed milch cows and related orientation.
- Distribution of seeds among 273 farmers to grow Mustard, Banana, Potato, Beans, Green Pea,

Strawberry, Elephant Foot Yam and Ginger. Promotion of "Half Acre Model".

- 10 farmers selected for especially Strawberry plantation as a High Value Crop.
- More than 2000 farmers have been supported for high yield & high value vegetable cultivation.
- Exposure Visits for 360 farmers at Birsa Agriculture University, ICAR-RCER Plandu, MASS in Jharkhand and an inter-state visit at KVK-Nawada, Bihar for 44 farmers.
- Promotion of Backyard Poultry, Duck Farming among 51 farmers and Kitchen Gardening for 30 farmers.
- Completion of 24 Mulching, 22 Drip and 04 Sprinkler units, functional for 50 farmers.
- 51 growers availed Soil Testing facility while 126 have been facilitated with Advance Technique Training to enhance their productivity.
- Farmer Field School approach that brings together a group of small-scale food producers to solve production problems through sustainable agriculture.
- Supported organic farming through use of Vermi-compost, 15 production units. Construction of 15 Azolla tanks to cultivate nutritious fodder for livestock. Feed-fodder management training to 70 animal keepers.
- Renovation of 08 Anganwadi Centers as Model Centers to impart quality services & education to children amid clean, comfortable environment, special caring for pregnant & lactating mothers.
- 07 Govt. Middle and Primary Schools have been introduced with "Smart Classes" for their students.

## CASE STORY

### Bandhu Oraon and His Farmer Field School



**S**hri Bandhu Oraon's ride from a humble agricultural background to a catalyst for innovative farming practices in his village serves as an inspiring story. A resident of Tangar village in Chanho block of Ranchi district, Bandhu's limited educational opportunities did not deter his determination to succeed in agriculture. His involvement with the Parivartan: HRDP initiative marked a turning point in his life.

Bandhu's extensive farming experience and innovative approach led to his selection as the leader of the Farmer Field School (FFS) in his village. Under his guidance, the FFS became a center for agricultural innovation, equipped with modern technology such as Poly Houses, Green Houses, Solar Pumps, Vermi-composting, Drip irrigation, and Mulching, provided by HRDP.

Bandhu's knowledge, gained from training sessions, interactive meetings, and exposure visits, enabled him to not only grow high-value crops but also establish a nursery for fruit and timber trees. He has become a key supplier of plantlets for the MGNREGA scheme and trains fellow farmers in adopting sustainable organic farming practices.

Today, Bandhu Oraon and his FFS stand as a beacon of success, increasing annual income above Rs. 1.5 Lakh inspiring all other farmers in the region and showcasing the transformative power of knowledge, innovation, and community engagement in rural agriculture.



## 02. SBI Gram Seva

## 04. Poverty Reduction through Self-Help Groups (Self-Sustainable)

- A pioneering intervention of NBJK since the year 1991 with a rich work experience of organizing women and wider concern of their socio-economic development.
- Coverage of 12 blocks in Hazaribagh, Ramgarh, Ranchi, Khunti districts of Jharkhand and 15 Slum areas of Patna in Jharkhand – Bihar.
- Organized women as their Self-Help Groups and men under Joint Liability Groups, responsibilities adhere to groups' office bearers.
- SHGs & JLGs hold regular meetings, ensure groups' internal saving and the members support each other to promote their livelihood activities.
- The program offers micro credit support service at doorstep of the groups with processing & monitors their minor businesses or income generation activities.
- Total 953 SHGs with 21102 members, micro credit provided to 5277 members of 588 SHGs, total loanee JLGs-384 with 1209 borrower members.
- Cumulative recovery rate is around 93.37% despite two consequent years halted by COVID pandemic.
- Direct support to bread-winners (81% women) of 6486 families and contributes to women's empowerment at large scale.



## CASE STORY Empowering Women through Microcredit



**M**rs. Tabassum Parveen, a resident of Lohsinghna in Hazaribagh, faced financial challenges with her husband, Syed Arshad Hussain, being the sole breadwinner as a newspaper hawker. In 2020, she joined a women's Self-Help Group (SHG) promoted by NBJK in her locality. With the support of the SHG, Tabassum borrowed a modest amount of Rs. 3,000 to tackle immediate needs, which she successfully repaid.

Buoyed by her initial success, Tabassum ventured into entrepreneurship; using a Rs. 30,000 loan to establish a mini shop at her home. The business thrived, leading her to expand further with microcredits of Rs. 38,000 and Rs. 44,000. These funds not only enriched her shop but also enabled her husband to purchase an electric three-wheeler, boosting their income.

Today, Tabassum's daily business exceeds Rs. 5,000, with a daily income ranging from Rs. 500 to Rs. 700. Her children attend an English medium school, and she dreams of a comfortable family life. With her recent loan of Rs. 49,000, she aims to further develop her shop. Tabassum's journey showcases the transformative power of SHG-microcredit and the empowerment it brings to women like her.

## 05. Lakhpati Kisan Smart Village

Support: CInI-an associate organization of Tata Trusts-Jamshedpur, JSLPS-Ranchi, ONGC Foundation-New Delhi, Drinking Water & Sanitation Dept.-GoJ

- Dedicated to income enhancement of the farmers through HVA (High Value Agriculture), irrigation and agro plus activities for achieving quality lives.
- Covers more than 7000 farmers in 144 villages of Murhu and Khunti blocks under Khunti district.
- An example of participatory development with community institutions like SHGs, farmers' clusters and an apex body/FPO as "Murhu Nari Shakti Kisan Producer Co. Ltd." with turnover of Rs. 03 crore 13 lakh during 2022-23.
- 3110 shareholders from 102 producer groups across 15 panchayats in Murhu block, a cash credit loan of Rs. 20 lakh under JOHAR project of JSLPS, GoJ, to grow its business.
- Diversified livelihood activities like High Value Agriculture as primary activity with NTFP Lac Cultivation & animal husbandry as secondary activity. 4516 farmers are lakhpati.
- Ensured economic returns as 4849 households benefitted by increased income from agriculture and allied activities.
- 2635 or 43.91% of HHs with improved irrigation facility as each HH avails irrigation for at-least 0.3 acre of land with water distribution system (solar micro-lift irrigation with pipeline distribution).





- 4516 or 75.2% HHs with increased income from improved animal husbandry practices, 4849 or 80.81% HHs benefitted from market linkage and 51% of SHGs categorized as grade 1 as per the NRLM guidelines.
- During Kharif season, 5750 HHs engaged with paddy & HVA upon 2983.31 acres, for Rabi HVA (3897 HHs, 712.37 acres) and for Summer HVA (2892 HHs, 448.62 acres).

## CASE STORY

## The Remarkable Transformation of Dabgana Village

**D**abgana, a remote village in the heart of Khunti district, once grappled with relentless poverty, limited water resources, and seasonal paddy cultivation that barely sustained its inhabitants, who were primarily migrant workers. The village nestled near the birthplace of renowned Adivasi leader and hockey player, Late Jaypal Singh Munda, yearned for change.

In 2022, hope arrived in the form of the "Lakhpati Kisan Smart Village" program. A producer group was born, leading to the linkage with Murhu Nari Shakti Kisan Producer Co. Ltd. This initiative introduced a Solar Micro-Lift Irrigation system, prioritizing families with little to no access to irrigation.

Water Use Groups were formed, ensuring proper asset maintenance, and user fees collection. High-Value Agriculture took root, with watermelon cultivation revolutionizing the villagers' fortunes. 16 farmers, on 3.2 acres of land, harvested 108 MT of watermelons, yielding a staggering return of Rs. 6,48,000.

Dabgana's transformation showcases the power of participatory intervention, eradicating migration and ushering in prosperity, making it a guiding light for rural communities.



## 06. Young India Mission Rozgar Support: UTI Mutual Fund, Mumbai

- A project upon skill development training for disadvantaged youths in various trades to address the issues of their livelihood, unemployment, forced migration and socio-economic enhancement.
- Designed with the components of well-equipped training centers, experienced faculties, technical know-how, practical classes, placement/self-employment assistance, sustainable livelihood opportunities, entry level job and skilled human resources for business houses & industries.
- Mission Rozgar Training Centers at Hazaribagh, Giridih and Koderma, 03 months skill development courses in the trades of Basic Computer Applications, General Duty/Nursing Assistance, Beautician-Mehndi-Bridal Makeup, Tailoring-Embroidery and Tally-Accountancy.
- Support activities like mobilizing aspirant youths for enrollment, counseling, mid-course exposure, motivational guest lecture, on job training, employers' meet etc.
- Training to total 1443 youths, out of which 848 are either placed or self-employed.



# 07. Usha Silai School

Support: Usha International-New Delhi, SIDBI & Individual Donors



- To develop rural women as entrepreneurs like capable tailors & trainers through comprehensive training upon tailoring, machine maintenance, life skills and all required inputs to start Usha Silai Schools in villages of Jharkhand-Bihar.
- Training to 50 women under Usha Classical Silai School segment at Godda (15), Ranchi (15), Giridih (10) and Gaya (10). The trainees got a new sewing machine, service manual book, syllabus, guidebook, and signage board with course completion certificate for each.
- Training to 300 women under Satellite Silai School part at Simdega (40), Gumla (40), Latehar (40), Lohardaga (40), Khunti (20), West Singhbhum (40), Dumka (40) and Nawada (40).
- SIDBI supported exposure visit of 23 Usha Silai School Teachers from Hazaribagh & Ranchi to Kishor Exports, a textile manufacturing unit at Ormanjhi, Ranchi.
- Organized Usha Archery Championship in Bolba block of Simdega district, participation of total 100 young archers and 30 have bagged medals as Gold-10, Silver-10 and Bronze-10.
- 06 Usha Silai School teachers from Hazaribagh have joined "Har Ghar Tiranga" campaign by SIDBI and made total 6,000 Khadi tricolor flags, later distributed among inhabitants in their respective areas through concerned Mukhiyas.
- Running 767 Usha Silai Schools & 557 Usha Satellite Schools in 47 districts of Jharkhand-Bihar, direct employment to 1,324 needy women from villages, average monthly income of Rs. 5,000-10,000 for each.

## CASE STORY Catalyzing Women's Empowerment

**S**uman Devi, a resident of Sirsiya village in Giridih Sadar block of Giridih district, Jharkhand, exemplifies the transformative power of the Usha Silai School program. For over two decades, Suman's life was constrained by societal norms and in-law restrictions, limiting her opportunities for personal growth. However, a chance encounter with a program volunteer changed everything.

Suman's determination led her to participate in a 7-day residential training program organized by NBJK-UIL-SIDBI in Hazaribagh. Despite initial family opposition, she persevered and completed the training, receiving the necessary resources to establish her Usha Silai School at home.

Her dedication and engaging teaching methods attracted students, with her school eventually growing to twenty students.

Suman's entrepreneurial spirit allowed her to earn a monthly income, boosting her confidence and financial independence. Her children now attend a good school, and she manages her own bank account.

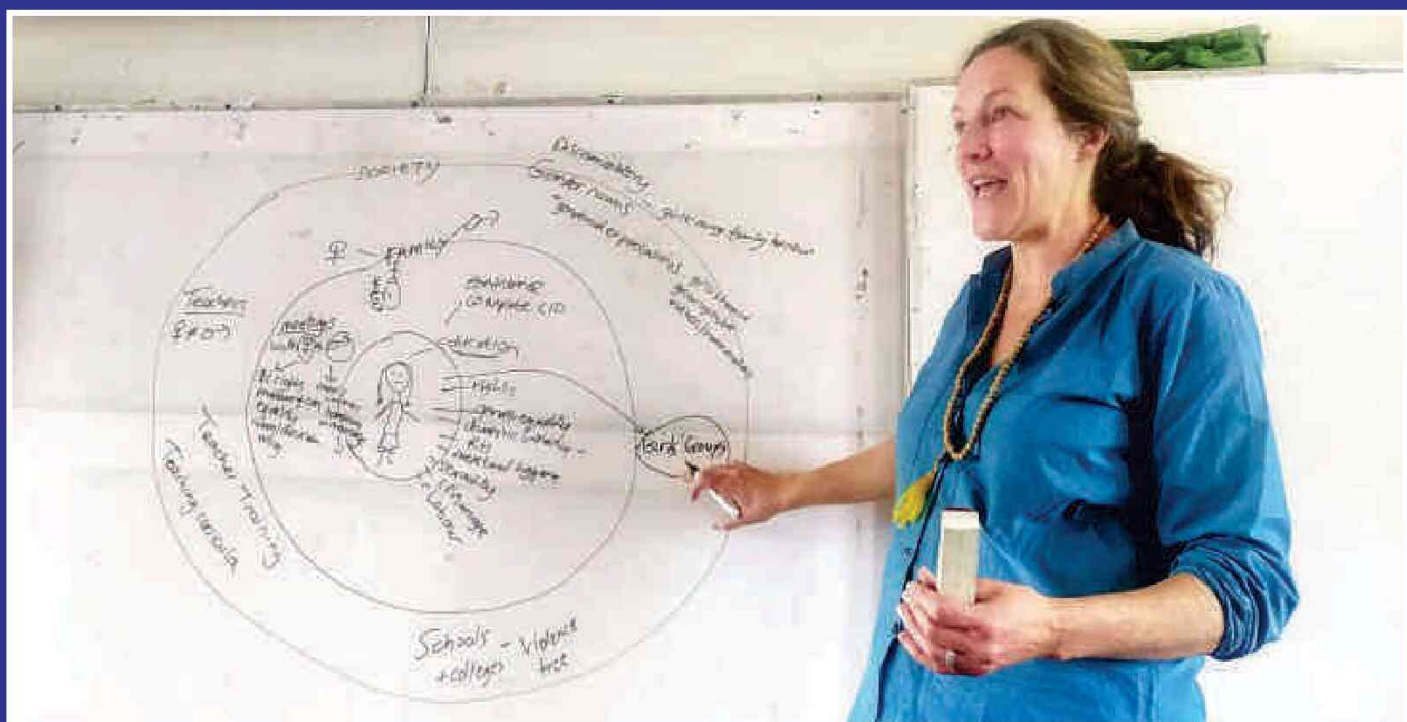
Her story highlights how the Usha Silai School program empowers women, enabling them to become responsible, independent decision-makers, and leading to increased productivity and fulfillment in their lives.

- Through Lok Prerna Kendra run NFE Center at village-Piri in Simariya block, 26 Birhor tribe children got primary education, while village-Birhu based Health Center has provided basic health facility to about 1000 poor people living at remote villages.
- Two days (11-12 Nov'22) workshop on Gender Mainstreaming, topics like sex & gender, gender norms, gender based discrimination and its impacts, 22 participants.
- By Local units of Lok Samiti, people have been made aware of hazardous effect of liquor consumption upon their health, families and children.

- 45th Foundation Day celebrated at JP's native place (village-Sitab Diara, Saran, Bihar) and Lok Samiti's national president Shri Girija Satish appealed to get rid of social evils like alcoholism, superstition, dowry, casteism and communalism.
- Jharkhand State Lok Samiti accepted declarations on prohibition, individual/family based development plan, non-government sector's participation for affordable education-health facilities, GM land to landless people etc in a meeting on 23 Sep'22.
- Bihar State Lok Samiti passed resolutions like exemption in electricity charge/taxes/revenue, irrigation facility, restoration of mandi system & minimum support price for farmers, libraries & subject wise teachers in schools and ending of Russo-Ukraine war in its executive committee meeting on 28 Sep'22.
- 20 places, 2730 participants, 11 events of convention, symposium, meeting, fasting, special days etc in Bihar-Jharkhand over the themes of Gandhi, JP, Emergency 25 June 1975, Anti-alcoholism, Unemployment, Social Harmony, Women, Laborers, Farmers, Sarvodaya, Lok Samiti etc.



### 02. Childline 1098

Support: Childline Foundation, Mumbai

- Under aegis of Ministry of Women and Child Development (GoI) 24-hour, toll free, emergency, phone outreach service for children (0-18) in distress to protect their rights, to rescue and assist them by responding on 1098 and by physically reaching out to such children.
- Covers a population of about 2 lakh 40 thousand at 426 villages of 71 panchayats under Chouparan, Barhi, Barkattha and Padma blocks in Hazaribagh district.

## CASE STORY

### Daya's Triumph

In a serene village, Daya (fictitious name), a 13-year-old farmer's daughter in 8th grade, faced a distressing challenge. Her school was 3 km away, and she used to walk there with her friends. However, an ill-behaved boy began to harass her, forcing her to stop attending school. Concerned for Daya's well-being, a friend provided her with Childline's toll-free number, 1098. They sought help together. Childline acted swiftly, visiting Daya's home, and engaging with her family and the boy's parents. Through counseling, the boy understood the gravity of his actions and apologized to Daya. His guardian expressed remorse, and the case was resolved amicably. This initiative impressed the villagers, prompting them to ensure a safe environment for all school-going girls. Daya, once a victim, reclaimed her education, inspiring her community. Childline's dedication showed that collective action can protect children's rights and create a safer world for all.

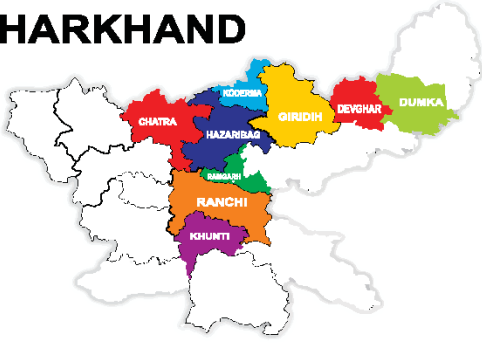

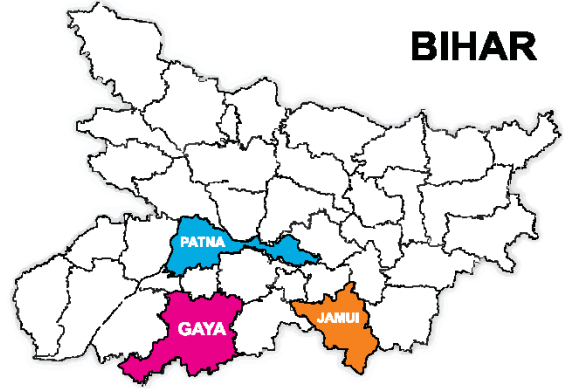
