

The Secretary's Note



This is our 53rd consequent year in the service to marginalized community by following the motif of Integrated Rural Development. With time, we have expanded our work both horizontally as well as vertically in Jharkhand-Bihar and have been able to influence the lives of more than three lakh people positively this reporting year, improving their social/economical/educational/health status a lot.

Besides other ongoing activities of the last year, the new initiatives in the year 2023-24 have been many. During the reporting year in the field of Education, NBJK run Amoli Apurva Middle School at Bahera Ashram campus (Chauparan, Hazaribagh) has met a major refurbishment initiative by SBI General Insurance Co. Ltd. This enriched the school's infrastructure and facilitated rural children's learning process in an innovative way. Another 400 adolescent schoolgirls from 9 high schools of Hazaribagh district have received new bicycles as "Wings of Hope" under the aegis of Care Today Fund on International Girl Child Day. Also, a new project named "Nav Jagriti" has been started across 10 villages of Gaya district with support from Kindernothilfe. It focuses upon eradication of Child Labour, Child Marriage and advocates for Child Rights among the most deprived Musahar community. Likewise, Gender Awareness was incorporated in Action Village India supported Girls' Education project that covers more than a thousand village girls over the themes of Gender Sensitization, Life Skills and Career Counseling besides supporting their secondary education.

New developments in the segment of Health-related initiatives, at LNJP Eye Hospital, Bahera (Chauparan, Hazaribagh), construction of a new OPD Section and arrival of new Medical Equipments were ensured with CSR support from D'Decor and Rare Family Foundation. Shri Jayant Sinha (Hon'ble MP from Hazaribagh) played a crucial role in garnering this financial assistance and inaugurated the NEW OPD section which enables the eye hospital to cater around 80,000 OPDs annually now. Seva Foundation helped here to create a modular Operation Theater that possesses automatic air handling units, steel walls, and a robust roof to virtually eliminate the risk of infections. Similarly, CMPDIL, Ranchi provided a new Mobile Eye Care Van to promote comprehensive eye screening camps in remote rural areas at doorstep. At Vimla Ramkrishna Bajaj Eye Hospital, Deoghar, the new Pediatric Ward got started with support of SBI Capital and two additional Vision Centers at Jhajha & Jasidih with help of Seva Foundation. For the Persons with Disabilities, Employability Training in the trades like Basic Computer and Nursing Assistant/Hospitality commenced with cooperation from Cheshire Disability Trust & Ujjivan Small Financial Bank. Out of 65 trained young Divyangjan, 42 got placed on job or engaged with self-employment.


Under the domain of Socio-Economic & Livelihood Development, NBJK initiated the Focused Rural Development Program (FRDP) in 15 villages of Chanho block in Ranchi district. HDFC Bank supports this program which concentrates upon micro planning for rain-water management and climate resilient sustainable agriculture by construction/renovation of ponds, check dams, rainwater harvesting and convergence with the government schemes. Goonj played significant role in renovation of ponds and bora-bandhs on rivers by voluntary contribution of labour by the villagers- a new feather in the cap of rural development. Likewise, in Giridih district, with support of ATE Chandra Foundation, we rejuvenated 49 old ponds by excavation and desilting. The silt was utilized as organic manure and this effort has ensured potential storage of about 510 million liters of rainwater, providing irrigation facilities to about 500 acres crop. The support of District administration and Niti Aayog had been significant in realization of this project. SIDBI supported a new initiative "Micro Enterprise Promotion Program" in Hazaribagh, Ramgarh, Giridih, Khunti and West Singhbhum districts. Within a short period of six months only, this promoted 155 sustainable units of micro enterprises by facilitating credit linkage with financial institutions and 100 units are being led by women. Also, SBI Life Insurance Co. Ltd. extended the 1st time grant to NBJK to run a Skill Training Center for marginalized youths of Hazaribagh district and more than 160 such youths, mostly females have secured jobs in business houses, healthcare units, academic institutions etc. at local level.

Under the sector of People's Action, the Lok Samiti continued its efforts to make Jharkhand and India free from liquor or other intoxicants. Also, we have organized a seminar upon "Prohibition of Alcohol in Religions" at Hazaribagh with representatives of different faiths. Likewise in Gaya convention on rights of farmers-laborers organized to highlight the issue of agronomy.

This year NBJK received "NGO Leadership Award" from EILM, Kolkata for its consistency, excellence in effective management of its programs, ethical operations, transparency, and community collaboration. Also NEEDS, Deoghar felicitated NBJK with "Jharkhand ChangeMaker Award" on its 25th foundation day.

I would like to express my sincere thanks and pay heartfelt gratitude to all the donors, supporters, friends, staffs, well-wishers and the community for providing the opportunity to serve at grassroots, bringing together a great difference in the lives of marginalized community.








II. Health, Hygiene, Environment & Disability -

- 04 Eye Hospitals, 260 Beds, 24 Vision Centers, 1274 Screening Camps, Total OPD 149745, Cataract Surgery 24750 (around 85% free), Other Surgeries 1408, Refraction 70159, Specs 39410.
- Through Mobile Medical Unit (MMU) organised 440 Outreach health camps in 20 villages, 5288 OPD consultations, successful treatment to patients with fever, cold & cough, dehydration, anemia, diabetes, fungal infection, joint pain, blood pressure, gynecological disorders etc.
- Menstrual Hygiene Management training to 2500 women & girls, 2107 have adopted safe & improved menstrual hygiene practices.
- Safe drinking water to 3058 households, Sanitation ensured through taking away 50 tons garbage, Wastes recycled as 825 MT Vermi Compost and 370 MT Green Millboard.
- Works with around 5000 Persons/Children with Disabilities, Vocational training-872, Placement/Self-employment-444, UDID enrollment-1525, Hospital assessment-594, Clubfoot surgery-63, Assistive devices-309, Linkage with govt. schemes & entitlement-750.

01. Amoli Apurva Primary School

(Support: Local Community, NBJK)



- Based at Prajapat Nagar village in Chouparan block of Hazaribagh district. Provides quality schooling for the children of Prajapat Nagar, Mangarh, Lohandi, Bahera, Noudiha, Koyali Khurd and Koyali Kala villages.
- Classes from Nursery to VI, total students – 176 (Girls 92, Boys 84), Free ship to 33 (Girls 19, Boys 14), Average result – 96.5%.
- CBSE pattern, play-way method, extra-curricular activities like song, dance, yoga, action play & different outdoor games like Kabaddi, Rumal Chor, Tug of war etc.
- Celebration of Independence Day, Republic Day, Teachers' Day and Children's Day with active participation of teachers & students.

02. Amoli Apurva Middle School

(Support: Local Community, Smt. Amoli & Shri Apurva)



- Situated at Bahera village of Chouparan block in Hazaribagh district, Serves the children from many villages like Bahera, Goshla, Telaiya, Mahdande, Sardarpur etc.
- U-DISE Code – 20040515906, School Code – 210284, Classes from I to VIII, Total 220 students (girls 111, boys 109), Freeship for 80 children (girls 50, boys 30).
- Hindi medium instruction, JCERT syllabus, regular PT-Sports-cultural activities & celebration of special days.

- Major refurbishment initiative by SBI General Insurance Co. Ltd. with 56 pieces of Desk & Bench, 10 pairs of table-chair, electrification in school building & ceiling fans in five class rooms, roof repairing in three class rooms, creative wall painting in each class room to facilitate learning process and four types of swing in ground. Inauguration by Mr. Clifford D'Costa (CSR Manager, SBI General Insurance) and Mr. Satish Giriya (Secretary, NBJK) on 13 March 2024.

03. Amoli Apurva High School

(Support: Local Community, NBJK, Surekha Bahen, Prakash Bhai, GiveIndia)



- Sited at Mangarh village in Chouparan block of Hazaribagh district, provides schooling facility to the children from 18 villages of Chouparan and Mayurhand (district-Chatra) blocks.
- Classes from VI to X, total strength – 460 students (girls 204, boys 256), fees relaxation for 34 students (girls 18, boys 16), affiliated with Jharkhand Academic Council, Ranchi.
- Co-curricular & extracurricular activities for students at regular basis, sports, cultural programs, celebration of the school's annual day & other special days, events of debate, speech etc.
- Total 77 (girls 32, boys 45) children appeared in class VIII board exam, 100% result. Likewise total 160 (girls 75, boys 85) students participated in class IX board exam, 100% result.
- Total 128 students (girls 58, boys 70) appeared for class X board exam, first division for 66 (girls 34, boys 32), second division for 58 (girls 22, boys 36), third division for 03 (girl 1, boys 02) and marginal for 01 (girl). 99.2% result.
- In class X board exam, top ten positions have been secured by girls like Jagriti Kumari (89.4%), Priti Kumari (87.8%), Payal Kumari (85.2%) and others.

04. Chandrakala Devi Daga High School

(Support: Local Community, NBJK, Mission Every Girl in School, Mission Keep No Child Hungry, GiveIndia, Educate a Girl Child By Supporting Her Fee, Online Danamojo, Online Individual Donors)



- Based at Kewaliya village of Chouparan block in Hazaribagh district. Access to 21 remote villages including Barahmoriya, Nariyahi, Kubri, Doiya, Bara, Mahudi, Nawdiha, Kenduwamore, Jiyachak, Sidhuchak etc.
- Classes from VI to X, total enrollment – 256 (girls 158, boys 98), all girl children avail sponsorship to continue their schooling and 13 boys get freeship from NBJK.
- 73 children (girls 49, boys 24) appeared for class VIII board exam and 69 (girls 46, boys 23) got Grade A+ & A, while 58 (girls 29, boys 29) out of 60 (girls 29, boys 31) have secured Grade A+ & A in class IX board exam. 100% result in both the classes.
- Total 85 students (girls 52, boys 33) appeared in class X board exam, 50 (girls 31, boys 19) passed with first division and 33 (girls 19, boys 14) scored second division. Highest marks as 81.2% by Punam Kumari, pass percentage - 98.8%.
- Contribution of more than 100 students in indoor-outdoor games, cultural activities as song & dance, debate & GK competition, speech delivery in Hindi & English etc. Prizes distributed among participants.

- Visits of Mr. Girija Satish (President, NBJK), Mr. Gandharv Gaurav (Program Director, NBJK) and Mr. Birendra Sinha (Manager, NBJK-Bahera) to encourage school students.

CASE STORY From Despair to Hope

Anjali Kumari, a 16-year-old girl from Doiya village in Chouparan block of Hazaribagh district, was born into a poor OBC family dependent on agriculture. Her parents, Mr. Rajesh Ram and Mrs. Anupa Devi, struggled to provide for Anjali, her two sisters, and one brother. The limited income from her father's small farm forced Anjali to discontinue her studies and take on household responsibilities, leaving her unhappy and unfulfilled.

In 2019, a ray of hope emerged when teachers from Chandrakala Devi Daga High School (CDDHS) visited her village during a mobilization campaign. They met Anjali's father and persuaded him to enroll Anjali in their school as a sponsored girl child, offering nearly free education. This opportunity allowed Anjali to resume her education without financial burdens.

Anjali's dedication to her studies paid off. In 2024, she appeared for her Class X board exams and passed with first division. She is now pursuing her Intermediate studies at Inter College, Chouparan. Anjali and her parents are immensely grateful to CDDHS and NBJK for the life-changing opportunity. Determined to complete her graduation and secure a job, Anjali aspires to become self-reliant and support her family, embodying the transformative power of education.



05. Surekha Prakash Bhai Public School Support: Local Community

- Located at Bahera village in Chouparan block of Hazaribagh district, reach up to 125 villages from Chouparan, Itkhori, Mayurhand blocks of Hazaribagh and Chatra districts.
- CBSE affiliation, nursery – XII classes, green spacious campus, affordable quality education, experienced teachers, regular participation of students in extra-curricular activities like sports, games, science exhibition, debate, quiz, drawing, yoga, extempore etc. & celebration of special days.
- Disciplined environment, promotion of girls to join in above said activities and showcasing of their marvelous achievements.
- Strength of total 1674 students (girls 630, boys 1044), freeship / scholarship / fees relaxation for 175 students (girls 78, boys 97).
- Total 73 children (girls 29, boys 44) appeared for class XII board exam, 42 (girls 22, boys 20) passed with first division, Anand Prashant got 90% as highest, overall result is 95%.
- 99% result in class X board exam, total examinees 171 (girls 56, boys 115), 98 (girls 43, boys 55) passed with first division, Saksham Raj Singh on top with 94%.
- Two former students - Purushottam Chourasia qualified for ISRO and Kajal Pandey became Sub-inspector in CISF.

06. Birsa Public School Support: Local Community, NBJK & Action Village India

- Placed at Deokuli village in Ichak block of Hazaribagh district, coverage of 09 far-flung villages of the block, priority to school education of girls in need.
- Co-education, classes from Nursery to X, Total Strength – 159 (girls 121, boys 38), AVI sponsors 95 girl children to complete their school education.
- Extracurricular activities, big campus, safe drinking water, toilets, regular classes, good result.
- Total 21 (girls 15, boys 06) appeared for class X board exam conducted by Jharkhand Academic Council, Ranchi, 14 (girls 11, boys 03) have obtained first division while 07 (girls 04, boys 03) passed with second division. 100% result.
- Fulfillment of learning materials & other requirements to the girl children on time, Suman Kumari is the school topper with 76.2% marks.



07. Roshni Dhruva High School Support: Local Community, NBJK, Smt. Roshni & Shri Dhruva Shah

- Placed at Nagri village in Churchu block of Hazaribagh district, Coverage of 36 villages in Churchu, Daru blocks of Hazaribagh district and Mandu block of Ramgarh district.
- Co-education, classes from VI to X, total enrollment – 227 (girls 105, boys 122), fees relaxation to 10 students (girls 05, boys 05).
- Digital classrooms, science lab, playground, experienced teachers, regular extracurricular activities & other facilities for students make the school as reputable one in the locality.
- Total 67 (girls 33, boys 34) students took part in class X board exam and 46 (girls 22, boys 24) have achieved first division, 17 (girls 08, boys 09) passed with second division while 03 (girl 01, boys 02) got third division and 01 girl was marginal. 98.5% result.
- Process initiated to erect a Water Tower in the school campus.

08. Komal Pujan Public School Support: Local Community, NBJK, Prakash Bhai Shah & Bhavin Bhai Shah

- Established at Silaunja village near Bodhgaya in Gaya district, provides affordable & quality education to the children from 35 villages of Bodhgaya, Mohanpur and Fatehpur blocks of Gaya district.
- Classes from Nursery to X, total strength – 500 (girls 160, boys 340), CBSE pattern, English medium, ICT based teaching, computer education, smart classes.
- Hostel, extracurricular activities, counseling facility, special teachers, auditorium, playground and congenial environment for children.
- Freeship to 10 students (girls 05, boys 05), Fees relaxation to 10 students (girls 06, boys 04).
- Among 07 students (girls 03, boys 04) appeared for class X board exam, 06 (girls 02, boys 04) passed with first division while 01 girl has achieved second division.
- Superior schooling at low fee for rural children, hygienic & disciplined milieu.



- Adolescent girls centric program with their access to quality education, gender empowerment, life skills, career counseling and healthcare services.
- The program involves five partner organizations like Stri Shakti (Hazaribagh), Lok Prerna Kendra (Chatra), Vikas Foundation (Dumka), Gram Nirman Mandal (Gaya) and Lok Shakti Shikshan Kendra (Gaya).
- Covers 1103 girls (465 sponsored & 638 at Learning Centers) from 07 blocks of Hazaribagh, Chatra, Dumka, Gaya districts in Jharkhand-Bihar.
- Total 306 girls appeared for class X board exam, 213 passed with first division, 68 achieved second division, 07 obtained third division and 18 were either marginal or didn't appear in the exam. 94% result.
- 17 Learning Centers (LCs) at villages in Sadar, Katkamsandi and Katkamdag blocks of Hazaribagh district, enrolled 638 girl children of class VIII, IX & X, provided them free coaching classes for Science, Math and English.
- 201 girls from LCs have appeared for class X board exam, 143 secured first division, 44 got second division, 04 passed with third division, 09 counted for marginal and 01 couldn't appear in the exam.
- LCs offer harmonious atmosphere for teachers & students through special training sessions for teachers, monthly tests & extracurricular activities for students, program monitoring & review, parents-teacher meetings etc.
- Initiation of Gender Awareness component across the project area, training & recruitment of Community Leaders to work over the themes of Gender Sensitization, Life Skills and Career Counseling among girls & women.
- Coverage of 94 villages, formation of 94 Groups of AVI supported Adolescent Girls and 31 Groups of their Mothers, 172 meetings with such girls with their huge participation in sessions on Gender Awareness (2100+), Life Skills (1344), Career Counseling (610).
- 285 meetings with Mothers' Groups, their active involvement as their presence in the sessions like Gender Awareness (2645), Life Skills (1050), Career Counseling (601).
- 238 meetings for other girls in villages as they have shared in large number as 2930 in Gender Awareness, 1581 in Life Skills and 810 in Career Counseling sessions.
- AVI Forum Meeting held at Puri (Odisha) during 03-06 October 2023 and participated by AVI's partner organizations across India including NBJK, represented by Mr. Satish Girija (Secretary), Mr. Rajeev Singh (Program Manager) and Mr. Kaushal Ganesh Azad (Social Activist with Lok Samiti).
- Field visit on 15-17 Feb'24 by Ms. Kavita Pandey (Executive Director, AVI), meetings with stakeholders, her valuable feedback.
- The program runs among the girls of deprived sections in society and aims to empower them.



CASE STORY Laxmi Kumari's Transformative Journey

Laxmi Kumari, a 16-year-old girl from Saraunikala village near Hazaribagh, has become a beacon of hope and inspiration. Her father, Pradeep Kumar, works as a cook at a modest restaurant, while her mother, Devanti Devi, is a housewife. Laxmi also has a younger brother who studies in class V. Despite her early struggles in school, Laxmi's determination to continue her education never wavered.

Financial constraints prevented her parents from affording a private tutor or allowing her to attend tuition classes in town due to cost and safety concerns. However, Laxmi's fortunes changed in 2021 when she learned about NBJK's Learning Center in her village from the center's teacher, Mr. Vicky Kumar. Enrolled in the center while in class VIII, Laxmi's dedication and regular attendance at both school and the tuition classes led to a significant improvement in her academic performance.

With the support of the NBJK-AVI program, which provides tuition support to girls from impoverished families in rural areas, Laxmi thrived. By 2024, her hard work culminated in a remarkable achievement: she scored 91.6% in her class X Board exams, the highest among all girls enrolled in the 17 Learning Centers.

Grateful for the invaluable support and guidance from her tuition teacher, Laxmi credits the program for her success. She passionately advocates for the continuation and expansion of such programs, recognizing their critical role in empowering rural girls through education. Aspiring to become an IAS officer, Laxmi's story is a testament to the transformative power of education and the enduring impact of community support.



10. Remedial Coaching Centers

Support: UTI Mutual Fund

- Enhance the quality of education and academic performance of girls in Jharkhand's government or village high schools through 30 Remedial Coaching Centers (RCCs).
- Provide quality instruction in Science, English, and Mathematics for marginalized students, motivate parents and the community towards the education of girls and disabled children, and improve school examination performance to pave the way for future careers.
- Target school girls in classes 8th, 9th, and 10th, covering 100 villages in Sadar, Daru, and Churchu blocks of Hazaribagh district, with an enrollment of 1,023 students from remote rural areas.
- Each RCC has a competent teacher responsible for organizing 2.5-hour pre/post-school classes and monthly tests, conducting monthly teachers' review meetings and parents-teacher meetings, hosting subject-wise quiz competitions and exposure visits, providing learning materials and motivational inputs for students, and offering periodical training for teachers.
- Maintain proper documentation with students' attendance registers, academic progress reports, and visitors' registers.
- In 2023, 314 girls prepared for the board examination: 235 (75%) achieved first division marks, 58 (18%) received second division marks, 2 girls passed with third division marks, 2 girls failed, and 17 girls did not appear for the exam due to personal issues. Many girls have applied for admission to colleges or +2 schools.



11. Bicycle Distribution Among School Girls

Support: Care Today & Mr. Jayant Sinha, MP-Hazaribagh

- On October 11, 2023, coinciding with International Girl Child Day and the 122nd Birth Anniversary of Loknayak Jay Prakash, 400 underprivileged girl students from 9 schools in Hazaribagh district received brand new bicycles.
- The event took place at Hazaribagh Stadium under the aegis of the "Care Today" CSR initiative by the India Today Group-TV Today Network, in collaboration with Hazaribagh MP Mr. Jayant Sinha.
- The total value of the 400 bicycles distributed is approximately Rs 20 lakh.
- MP Jayant Sinha praised the credibility of NBJK in the field of social service and expressed his happiness to support this initiative.
- As part of this program, a bicycle bank has been created. Once a girl completes class X, her bicycle will be passed on to another school girl, ensuring continuous benefit.
- This initiative marks an important moment in the lives of these daughters, helping to alleviate their educational challenges and providing a convenient means of commuting from home to school. This will allow them more time for their studies, contributing to their academic success and overall well-being.



12. Lord Buddha Home for Children

Support: Stichting Kinderhulp Bodhgaya, NBJK

- A place of safety for needy children at village-Silaunja near Bodhgaya (Gaya, Bihar) to provide them quality food, cloth & education free of cost.
- The children belong to 34 villages of 17 blocks in 03 districts of Bihar-Jharkhand.
- LBHC takes responsibility of total 57 children (girls 33, boys 24) out of which 20 (girls 07, boys 13) live in campus and enrolled in NBJK run Komal Pujan Public School in the same premises.
- The alumni are performing well as 03 have joined engineering college, 01 pursues post-graduation in agriculture, 04 got job after completion of diploma in vocational courses, 21 are doing graduation in arts or science streams, 07 have passed class X board exam and 13 children chosen to be with their legal guardians for better education.
- Extracurricular activities, celebration of important days, yoga sessions, regular study hours, extra tuition, computer classes, gardening and contribution of children in institutional management.



Ganesh Kumar, a 21-year-old budding engineer, showcases resilience and determination. Pursuing a B. Tech. in Chemical Engineering at Dr. B. R. Ambedkar National Institute of Technology, Jalandhar, his journey highlights the transformative power of support and education. Orphaned at four, he found a home at Lord Buddha Home for Children (LBHC) at seven.

LBHC provided Ganesh with essential care, quality food, clothing, and excellent schooling. Engaging in extracurricular activities, he thrived as a cricketer. Academically, he scored 81% in his class X board exams and chose to study science and math. In class XII, he achieved 83% and attended coaching classes for engineering entrance exams. His hard work paid off when he passed JEE Mains and Advanced in 2021, securing admission to the prestigious Dr. B. R. Ambedkar National Institute of Technology, Jalandhar.

Now in his third year, Ganesh completed his 5th semester with a CGPA of 7.0. LBHC has supported his education and living expenses throughout. Grateful to LBHC for its pivotal role in his life, Ganesh aspires to become a successful engineer and contribute to the lives of other orphaned children. His story is a powerful reminder of how unwavering support and personal determination can turn adversity into achievement.

13. Adolescent Reporters

Support: UNICEF Jharkhand

- Completion of three batches with 06 trainees in each batch, fourth batch started in March'24.



15. Nav Jagriti Support: Kindernothilfe



- With aim to eradicate child labour and child marriage from Musahar community by empowering children to claim their rights and making them duty bearers accountable towards fulfilling child rights.
- Intensive work among Musahar families across 10 villages in Bodhgaya and Mohanpur blocks of Gaya district.
- Intended to sensitize 1600 children of 06-14 age group on child rights & children's issues to make them advocates against child labour-child marriage as well as to equip 800 youths (15-18 years) with knowledge on child rights-child labour-child marriage, hygiene, nutrition and providing them livelihood opportunities. CASE STORY From Darkness to Light: Adhir's Vision Restored

Adhir Mohali, a 65-year-old bamboo artisan from Saharpur village in Jamtara district, Jharkhand, faced significant challenges due to a cataract in his left eye. This condition blurred his vision, making daily tasks and work increasingly difficult. As his small business was his only source of income, the visual impairment led to economic hardships for Adhir and his family.

Recognizing the severity of his condition, a healthcare motivator from NBJK-run LokNayak JayPrakash Eye Hospital, Dumka visited Adhir to assess his eye health. The diagnosis revealed the urgent need for cataract surgery. The motivator explained the procedure's importance and its potential to restore Adhir's vision and improve his quality of life.

On May 2, 2023, with support from Sightsavers India, Adhir underwent successful cataract surgery at LNJEH-Dumka. The operation restored his vision, enabling him to resume his work and effectively manage his small business. This timely medical intervention not only improved Adhir's vision but also alleviated the economic challenges he faced.

Adhir's story highlights the transformative impact of accessible eye healthcare in underserved communities. LNJEH-Dumka continues to bring light into the lives of many by providing essential eye care services to the remotest villages of the Santhal Pargana region.

Restoring Vision and Independence

Ram Ratan Yadav, a 70-year-old farmer from Nagariyawa village in Tekari Block, Gaya District, faced significant challenges due to vision impairment in his right eye. For six months, his deteriorating sight made it difficult to see, especially at night, causing frequent headaches and forcing him to rely on his family, particularly his wife, for daily tasks. This compounded the economic strain on his family, who already struggled to make ends meet through farming and labor work.

A turning point came when Ram Ratan Yadav attended a free eye screening camp organized by Lok Nayak Jay Prakash Eye Hospital. There, he was diagnosed with cataracts and advised to undergo surgery. Understanding the urgency, he promptly agreed to the procedure.

The cataract surgery was a success, and Ram Ratan Yadav experienced an immediate improvement in his vision. He expressed immense relief and gratitude, noting that he could now resume his work independently. The hospital's comprehensive support, including free transportation, meals, post-surgery care, and protective black goggles, further aided his recovery.

With his eyesight restored, Ram Ratan Yadav no longer depends on others for his daily tasks. He expressed heartfelt thanks to the hospital and its services, which have enabled him to regain his independence and improve his quality of life.

CASE STORY Vision of Hope: A Young Girl's Sight Reinstated

In the remote village of Mahulbani, Deoghar, nine-year-old Radhika Kumari's life took a miraculous turn. Living with her widowed mother, Mrs. Suhagi Devi, in a financially constrained scheduled caste family, Radhika struggled with severe vision problems stemming from an early childhood injury to her right eye. Despite these challenges, she diligently attended her village school, though frequent vision issues often left her disheartened.

Radhika's mother, seeking a solution, took her to an eye screening camp organized by the Vimla Ramkrishna Bajaj Eye Hospital (VRBEH) at Sarwan block headquarters. The doctors there identified the need for an Intraocular Lens (IOL) transplant, a procedure far beyond the family's financial means.

Hope arrived in the form of Mr. Aniruddh Pillai, a compassionate sponsor from the USA, who generously offered to cover all medical expenses. On April 29, 2023, Radhika underwent successful lens transplant surgery at VRBEH. The operation restored her vision completely, transforming her future.

Radhika's joyous recovery has filled her family with immense gratitude towards Mr. Pillai and the dedicated team at VRBEH. This heartwarming story stands as a testament to the profound impact of kindness and medical intervention in changing lives.



05. SBI Sanjeevani Clinic on Wheels

Support: SBI Foundation

- Provides free primary health services with on-the-spot checkups and medications at the doorstep of villagers.
- Covers approximately 50,000 residents across 20 villages in Bodhgaya and Sadar blocks of Gaya district, Bihar.
- Conducts weekly outreach health camps in each village, offering quality healthcare, follow-up services, and dedicated care for the poor, elderly, dependents, and women in need of preventive, curative, and referral services, particularly those unable to visit hospitals or private clinics.
- Regular visits by a mobile clinic van equipped with advanced medical devices such as a portable microscope, ECG, gastro fiberscope, autoclave, stretcher, lab facilities, and other essential diagnostic tools.
- The medical team consists of a doctor, lab technician, pharmacist, and health assistant-cum-driver.
- Conducted 440 camps, with 5288 OPD consultations, successfully treating patients with conditions such as fever, dehydration, anemia, diabetes, blood pressure issues, fungal infections, coughs and colds, joint/spasmodic pain, arthritis, kidney stones, and gynecological disorders.
- Organized two special health camps focused on anemia, diabetes, fungal infections, and hygiene, along with awareness and sanitation drives under the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan. Distributed sanitary pads and provided counseling on personal health and hygiene to adolescent girls, along with distributing soaps, phenyl, bleaching powder, and brooms in the villages.



CASE STORY

Neelam Kumari's Recovery with SBI Sanjeevani-NBJK

Neelam Kumari, a 28-year-old housewife from a small farming family in Bhaiya Bigha village, Bodhgaya block, Gaya district, faced a persistent fungal infection in her right hand. Initially, she tried home remedies, but they proved ineffective. Her condition persisted until the mobile medical van of SBI Sanjeevani arrived in her village.

Neelam consulted Dr. Syed Faizan Amin and his team, who diagnosed her condition and provided her with an array of medications, including PPI,



antifungal medicines, ointments, antibiotics, and anti-allergic drugs. After diligently using these medicines for about three weeks, Neelam experienced significant relief from her fungal infection.

Grateful for the effective treatment, Neelam expressed her heartfelt thanks to Dr. Amin and the SBI Sanjeevani-NBJK team for offering free medical care to many villagers like her, bringing much-needed relief and health support to her community.

06. Waste to Wealth: Solid Waste Recycling-cum-Demonstration Units (Self-Sustainable)



- Successfully demonstrated value addition to wastes by recycling them into environmentally friendly products.
- Promoted organic farming and packaging through innovative recycling methods.
- Established two units in Chakla village, Ormanjhi block, Ranchi district: Vermi-compost from cow dung and Millboard from scrap paper.
- Produced 825 MT of Vermi-compost, utilized by local farmers, nurseries, agricultural enterprises, and the forest department.
- Manufactured 370 MT of Green Millboard, demanded by bookbinders, sweet/shoe box makers, notebook printers, and photo framers across Jharkhand.
- Enhanced skills and provided employment for 16 local villagers, comprising both women and men.

07. Clean Jharkhand Project, Phase II (Self-Sustainable)

- Ensures a hygienic environment at two major premises: Damodar Valley Corporation and Hotel Canary Inn in Hazaribagh city.
- Cleanliness drives and housekeeping, Drainage clean-up operations, Waste collection and disposal services, transferring waste to municipal garbage vans.
- A dedicated team of 15 Safai Mitras, including one supervisor, Expertise in segregation, handling approximately 50 tons of garbage.
- Extensive experience and expertise in the sanitation field, High reliability and consistency in service delivery, Strong appreciation and positive feedback from clients.
- Focused on self-sustainability and continuous improvement in hygiene and sanitation practices.



08. Community-Based Inclusive Development & Rehabilitation of Persons with Disabilities Support: Bajaj Finserv Limited



- To ensure the socio-economic inclusion and community-based rehabilitation of Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) by providing sustainable livelihood opportunities, healthcare, education, organizational support, and other essential services.
- Operating in 20 slums in Patna, benefiting around 5000 PwDs, predominantly from Below Poverty Line (BPL) families.
- Enrolled 1525 PwDs for UDID, facilitating transportation, refreshment, and registration for hospital assessments of 594 PwDs.

09. Cheshire Disability Trust Employability Training for Persons with Disabilities

Support: Cheshire Disability Trust & Ujjivan Small Finance Bank

- To ensure empowerment of Persons with Disabilities through their training and employment.
- Coverage of urban area as Hazaribagh town and villages of Sadar, Katkamsandi, Katkamdag, Ichak, Barkagaon, Tatijhariya, Daru, Bishnugaarh blocks of Hazaribagh district.
- The project started on 23rd November '23, provided transformative month long training program for each batch, three batches passed out.
- Offered comprehensive vocational training in the trades like Basic Computer and Nursing Assistant / Hospitality with support on Personality Development, Sign Language, and English Proficiency through communication skills & projector based classes.
- Total 65 trainees (50 locomotors, 15 deaf & dumb) have been provided training as 52 in Basic Computer and 13 in Nursing Assistant / Hospitality, 42 have been placed at Hazaribagh or nearby places.
- The trainees have been placed at Common Service Center, Farm House, Medical Shop, Grocery Shop and some are self-employed also.
- An effort to bridge the gap between ability and opportunity, visit by Mr. S. Nazarullah from CDT on 27 February 2024.



CASE STORY

Overcoming Misfortune

Tuleshwar Kumar Mahto, a 30-year-old from Kandsar village of Katkamsandi block in Jharkhand's Hazaribagh district, has defied the odds despite being 80% disabled due to polio. Raised in a poor family, Tuleshwar's determination led him to complete his education, passing class X in 2009 and class XII in 2011, even though he faced numerous challenges.

Living with wife, child and elderly mother after his father's death, Tuleshwar found it hard to sustain the family through farming alone. His life changed when he discovered a month-long residential skill training course by Cheshire Disability Trust at Nav Bharat Jagruti Kendra. Enthusiastically, he joined the Basic Computer Applications trade and successfully completed the course.

Today, Tuleshwar works as an Assistant Manager at Happy Farm House in Lara village (block-Churchu, Hazaribagh) earning Rs. 5000 per month with free accommodation and food. His employer is pleased with his performance, and Tuleshwar regularly sends money home, supporting his family. With his workplace about 30 km from his village, sometimes he visits his family, finding joy and fulfillment in his newfound stability. Tuleshwar reflects, "Now I feel happy and healthy; having faced tougher times, this progress is a significant relief."



10. Caring of Carers

Support: Carers Worldwide



- Improving family care services for individuals with disabilities, diseases, mental health issues, or geriatric conditions by supporting their caregivers.
- Highlighting the challenges carers face as they dedicate their personal lives to care, and advocating for necessary policy support.
- Implemented in five blocks of Hazaribagh district: Sadar, Daru, Katkamsandi, Katkamdag, and Ichak.
- Identified 1005 carers from economically disadvantaged families in villages, organized them into 89 self-help groups, 5 clusters, and a government-registered federation, Pragati Carers Seva Sanstha. Supported 207 carers with livelihood opportunities.
- Conducted regular cluster and SHG meetings for problem sharing and collective resolution efforts.
- Engaged in extensive advocacy for a Charter of Demands to the government, including Recognition of carers, Carer allowances, Special budget in local bodies, Employment and social security scheme linkages, Establishment of caring-vocational training centers, Medical aid for dependents etc.
- Celebrated Carers' Day on 19 October 2023, submitted memorandums to the govt. officials & elected representatives.

SOCIO-ECONOMIC & LIVELIHOOD DEVELOPMENT

01. Parivartan: Holistic Rural Development Program

Support: HDFC Bank

- The project aims to enhance sustainable agriculture and allied activities with advanced technical practices, boosting family incomes by at least 50% in four years from baseline data, promote village-based enterprises and dairy farming, implement solar-based irrigation, drip mulching, poly house for soilless seedlings, and various agricultural technologies, develop water resources for irrigation, drinking, and sanitation, support micro-enterprises for youth and women, provide vocational training for youth for job or self-employment, improve government school infrastructure and educational facilities, and introduce solar power for homes, street lighting, pump-sets, and Jal-Minars.
- Operational across 15 villages of Tanger, Raghunathpur, Lundri, Silagain and Chatkal panchayats in Chanho block under Ranchi district (Jharkhand) where most of people belong to tribal or OBCs communities.
- Infrastructure development for digital learning, child friendly environment in 08 model schools and 16 Anganwadis.
- Installation of 150 solar street lights, construction of 02 Check Dams for irrigation support to 50 acres land, formation of 04 Farmer Field School those introduced improved agricultural practices, new crops, instruments & training among farmers.
- Drip support (pilot phase) to 45 farmers, renovation of 05 Ponds for irrigation purpose, pilot phases of cultivating Strawberry (15 farmers), Shimla Mirch (04 farmers), Grafted Tomato (10 farmers) & Soybean (20 farmers).
- New crop intervention & income generation for 45 farmers by cultivation of Oal, introduced early varieties of French Beans (40 farmers), Green Pea & Ginger (100 farmers), Potato (70 farmers), Wheat (70 farmers) and ensured Paddy cultivation with SRI method (30 farmers).
- Popularized Organic farming and alternative fodder as linked 45 farmers with Vermi compost production and Azolla cultivation.
- Support in Cow purchase to 118 farmers for income generation-livestock rearing practices, ensured Poultry farming to 45 farmers and Duck farming to 37 farmers for reproduction & egg selling.
- Associated 25 farmers with Pig rearing (pilot phase) for reproduction & pig selling as well as connected 10 farmers with Bee Keeping.
- Inclusion of around 150 young farmers in various self-reliance training programs.
- Organized 45 health camps and catered 2300 women-adolescent girls, conducted 15 Paravet camps to make farmers aware on livestock rearing.
- Promotion of an FPO namely Chanho Birsa Munda Sangathan Producer Co. Ltd. with 450 shareholders, assets support (pilot phase) like a Cold Storage (5 MT), Mobile Solar Pump, Cold Press Oil Mill for farmers' benefits.
- Significant convergence with Government through FPO like asset support as a mini rice mill, mini tractor with accessories, paddy cutter, water pump with 1HP motor, 14 power sprayers, 30 manual spray machines and improved varieties of seeds of mustard (2 qtl), black gram (4.8 qtl), green gram (2 qtl), madua (2 qtl), masoor (2 qtl) were distributed among farmers. Also for soil improvement Dolomite (20 qtl), Phosphogypsum (12.50 qtl), for seed treatment Rhyzobium culture (5 kg), for bacteria treatment Phosphate solubilizing (5 kg) and for pests control Chlorpyrifos (5 lit) have been provided to the farmers.
- Visits and appreciation by the Govt. Officials, MLAs & PRIs members.



CASE STORY

Surajmani: Revolutionizing Traditional Farming

Mrs. Surajmani Minj, a 36-year-old tribal woman from Nawadih-Ganeshpur village in Chanho block, lives with her husband and two school-going sons. Dependent on traditional farming methods, Surajmani's family struggled to achieve self-sustainability. The Holistic Rural Development Program (HRDP) intervention in 2021 marked a turning point. HRDP introduced Surajmani to modern agricultural techniques, including soilless seedlings and drip irrigation. With comprehensive training and support, she established these systems, significantly enhancing her productivity. Surajmani diversified her crops and embraced natural pest control, drastically reducing harmful chemical usage.

A government-provided polyhouse, facilitated by HRDP, allowed her to grow crops in a controlled environment, protecting them from adverse weather and pests. This modern approach led to richer crop yields and increased income. Beyond her own success, Surajmani began supplying soilless seedling beds to other farmers and cultivating new seed varieties, further boosting her earnings. Promoting organic fertilizers and natural pest control, Surajmani contributed to environmental health and water conservation through drip irrigation. Her success and sustainable practices have made her a role model in her community. HRDP's support has empowered Surajmani to become a self-sustainable, profitable farmer and a beacon of empowerment for others.



02. Focused Rural Development Program

Support: HDFC Bank

- Implementation in 15 villages of Taranga, Choreya, Roll and Karkat panchayats in Chanho block of Ranchi district. These villages are comprised of 4,964 households with 26,813 residents mainly from ST, OBC & SC communities.
- With the objective of micro-planning of each village for water management and climate resilient sustainable agriculture through a wide range of activities like construction/renovation of ponds-small pucca check dams-soak pits, installation of rainwater harvesting system at community places, trenching & plantation, identification & repair of non-functional hand pumps, roof water collection, bunding, development of farmer field schools, introduction of cover crops, promotion of Azolla farming- Vermi compost making-high yield crops, mass awareness, convergence with government etc.
- Renovation of 04 community ponds with irrigation coverage of around 10 hectares of farm land, 50 farmers could increase their land productivity up to 50%.
- Constructions of 30 soak pits, 30 bunds and 45 trenches. 05 Roof water harvesting systems in 02 govt. schools & 03 community buildings. Around 1500 people including 700 school children have been oriented about the benefits of rooftop water collection.
- Installation of 155 solar street lights benefitting roughly 2000 households, repairing of 07 hand pumps ensured safe drinking water to 70-75 households.
- Distribution of spraying machines among 69 farmers, their farm productivity increased by 20 percent.
- Distribution of high yielding improved variety seeds of mustard (35 farmers), gram (12 farmers), wheat (36 farmers), moong (300 farmers) and 25 farmers were provided mushroom kits including training through convergence with the Government schemes.
- Field visits for 16 farmers to learn about technical aspects of farming practices, specifically drip irrigation, enabled them to enhance their farming techniques.
- Construction of 05 Vermi Compost Pits in two villages, 05 acres of farm land converted to organic and 05 farmers have increased their income by 50%.
- Awareness generation events in operational villages, participation of the members from Village Development Committees, discussion about improvement in farmers' income.
- Formation of Water Management Committees, distribution of carpet, bucket, mug etc among WMCs.
- Setup of 01 Dal Mill, 01 Millet & Flour Grinder Machine, 02 Pack Houses to two farmers, 02 Green Sheds to two farmers, distribution of 2400 Papaya Plants among 04 farmers and 960 plants of Litchi, Lemon and Pomegranate among 02 farmers through convergence with the Govt. schemes.



03. SBI Gram Saksham

Support: SBI Foundation

- The project aims to enhance water storage capacity by repairing existing wells and renovating existing ponds, improve access to irrigation facilities through the distribution of electric motor pumps, boost agricultural productivity to increase farmers' income, and promote integrated sustainable development in adopted villages also under the previously implemented SBI Gram Seva initiative.
- Implementation in villages of Chakai block in Jamui district (Bihar) and Deoghar Sadar block under Deoghar district (Jharkhand).

Chakai Part:

- Coverage of 10 villages i.e. Kashjor, Baljori, Gajhi, Sone, Guriyadih, Gosaedih, Narodih, Pipra, Kalibak and Badiyadih along with 05 more villages like Heth Chakai, Patjori, Chhachudih, Garhi & Mamtadih, adopted earlier under SBI Gram Seva.
- Reconstruction of 50 existing wells across 10 villages selected for SBI Gram Saksham and 05 villages chosen under SBI Gram Seva. Benefitting around 500 inhabitants of these villages.
- Renovation of 12 existing ponds as 10 in SBI Gram Saksham villages and 02 in SBI Gram Seva villages. Ensured irrigation facility in 12 villages.
- Distribution of 150 electric motor pump sets among farmers of 10 SBI Gram Saksham villages and 05 SBI Gram Seva villages. 900 beneficiaries.
- Maintenance of identified community infrastructure developed previously under SBI Gram Seva like Community Platforms renovated in Chhachudih-Mamtadih-Heth Chakai-Patjori villages, Water tank & motor pump repairing-school gate set up at Mamtadih Middle School, Kitchen room renovation-electric wiring-inverter's battery replacement at Heth Chakai Middle School, Kitchen room-water tank repairing at Patjori Middle School, repaired Sewing machines at SBI Prerna Kendra in Hethchakai village and construction of one Soak pit at Garhi village.

- Coverage of 10 villages i.e. Modidih, Babudih, Gokhuldih, Dighriya, Jormoh, Joruwadih, Tetriya, Semradih, Dumarkundi and Bandarbasa along with 05 more villages like Nawadih, Barsatiya, Ramaldih, Sahari & Gadi, adopted earlier under SBI Gram Seva.
- Revival of 50 existing wells in 10 villages selected under SBI Gram Saksham, resulted as increased water storage capacity, easy availability of water for drinking & irrigation purpose.
- Renovation of 11 existing ponds in 10 villages focused under SBI Gram Saksham. An immense relief to farmers with water accessibility for irrigation.
- Distribution of 150 units of electric motor pump with accessories among farmers in 10 villages covered under SBI Gram Saksham and in 05 villages of SBI Gram Seva. Ease of irrigation for 750 farmers.
- Community assets created earlier under SBI Gram Seva have been renovated and repaired like renovation of Community Platforms at Nawadih-Barsatiya-Sahari villages, construction of a Soak Pit at Nawadih and repair of the building of Remedial Coaching Center at Ramaldih villages.
- At the Community Information Centers established in villages under SBI Gram Seva, Computer Systems have been repaired at CICs at Nawadih-Gadi-Ramaldih-Barsatiya, Xerox machines repaired at CICs of Nawadih-Gadi and printer at Nawadih CIC.
- In SBI Gram Seva covered Ramaldih village, Sewing Machines have been repaired at SBI Prerna Kendra, Interior painting-purchase of 06 batteries-antivirus update-repair of 09 computers at Digital Class Room of +2 High School.
- 89 Community Meetings across 10 villages of SBI Gram Saksham and 05 villages of SBI Gram Seva.
- Under SBI Gram Saksham, 04 training programs for farmers have been organized at Jormoh, Modidih, Semradih and Dumarkundi, participation of 241 farmers from all 10 operational villages. These training events were focused upon profit making modern techniques of cultivation, low water crops, diseases & treatment, different schemes for farmers etc.
- Celebration of World Water Day at Semradih village, awareness meeting over the intervention of SBI Gram Saksham.

CASE STORY

Flourishing Fields: Reviving Agriculture and Hope in Gokhuldih Village



In Gokhuldih village of Deoghar Sadar block, Satya Narayan Raut and Jyoti Devi faced relentless challenges with their rain-fed 1.30-acre farm. With an unreliable well, scarce water, and insufficient Kharif crops, the family struggled financially, often relying on loans and daily wage labor in Deoghar township for survival.

In 2023, their village became part of the "SBI Gram Saksham" project by Nav Bharat Jagriti Kendra, in collaboration with SBI Foundation. The couple joined the project, and their well was selected for renovation, significantly increasing its water capacity. "Earlier there was no water in my well, but after getting repaired, there is enough water there," Satya Narayan confirmed. This improvement enabled them to irrigate one acre of land and farm effectively.

Additionally, the project provided an electric motor pump to a group of six farmers, including Satya Narayan and Jyoti. This equipment was instrumental in efficiently irrigating their fields. Consequently, they could cultivate Kharif, Rabi, and Zaid crops, leading to a rich yield and food security for the entire year.

This transformation allowed the family to save Rs. 30,000 and reduced their need to seek daily wage work. Grateful for the support, Satya Narayan and Jyoti extended their heartfelt thanks to NBJK and SBI Foundation for revitalizing their agricultural livelihood and enhancing their quality of life.

 - Construction/repair supervision training for VWSC members (17 villages, 302 participants), Comprehensive accounts keeping training (16 villages, 18 sessions, 54 participants), Operation & Management training for VWSC members (20 villages, 27 sessions, 345 participants).
 - Social & Behavior Change Communications: 28 school events involving 807 students in 17 villages, Rallies in 19 villages and poster distribution in 24 villages.
 - Collaboration with District Water & Sanitation Department and District Administration. Grading of VWSCs and Jal Sahiyas.
- **Integrated Project: Phase II of Gender Empowerment through Menstrual Hygiene Management (MHM)**, coverage of the same villages as of Lakhpati Kisan™ under Murhu and Khunti blocks of Khunti district.
 - Phase II of the MHM initiative, jointly implemented by CInI and NBJK, focuses on empowering 5,000 women and girls in the villages. The initiative addresses menstrual hygiene challenges caused by persistent taboos and limited access to sanitary materials and disposal options.
 - Conducted four modular MHM training sessions for 1,838 women and 662 adolescent girls.
 - Produced 110 cloth pads and sold 83 units through newly selected entrepreneurs linked with the Usha Silai School program.
 - Organized two health camps for women and girls suffering from Reproductive Tract Infection (RTI) and Urinary Tract Infection (UTI).
 - Mobilized 493 women and girls to use Matka (earthen pot) incinerators for safe disposal of sanitary pads, with 309 Matka incinerators installed in villages.
 - Provided MHM training to 83 ASHAs and Anganwadi workers.
 - With these efforts, 2,107 beneficiaries have adopted safe and improved menstrual hygiene practices.



CASE STORY

Gangi Purty: The Impact of Menstrual Hygiene Management Training

Gangi Purty, a 22-year-old graduate from Kundibartoli village, lives with her father, two brothers, and sister-in-law. Following her mother's early death, Gangi lacked proper guidance on menstrual hygiene. The family's primary income comes from agriculture, supplemented by her brothers' daily wages.

A member of a local women's self-help group, Gangi attended a Menstrual Hygiene Management (MHM) training session led by Mrs. Fulijencia Kandulna. Before this training, Gangi suffered from heavy white discharge, severe blood flow, and vaginal itching without understanding the causes or remedies.

The four-day training covered topics such as adolescence, bodily changes, menstrual cycles, hygienic practices, cancer awareness, and the safe disposal of menstrual products. This comprehensive education profoundly changed Gangi's approach to menstrual hygiene. She learned to change pads frequently and created a Matka Incinerator for safe disposal of used pads.

As a result, Gangi's health improved significantly, alleviating her issues with white discharge and itching. She acknowledges that despite her college education, she was unaware of these vital health practices until the training. Grateful to NBJK-CInI for this knowledge, Gangi now actively promotes menstrual hygiene awareness in her village, helping to educate the next generation on this crucial subject.



05. Pond Rejuvenation in Collaboration with District Administration and the Community

Support: ATE Chandra Foundation & NITI Aayog

- To enhance rainwater holding capacity of ponds through desilting, utilizing silt as organic manure for agriculture, recharging underground water, maintaining soil moisture, and ensuring water availability for cattle during summer. This innovative initiative targets the farming community in village areas.
- Operational in villages across all 13 blocks of Giridih district, Jharkhand, with live interaction between district administration and farmers.
- Excavation and desilting of 49 old ponds, with villagers referring to the removed silt as "Amrit Khad".
- Farmers, at their own cost, transported the silt using tractors to their fields, enhancing soil fertility.
- Removal of approximately 510,000 cubic meters of silt, resulting in potential storage of 510 million liters of rainwater.
- NBJK organized village meetings, encouraged farmers to use silt at their own expense, mobilized community, coordinated with district administration, and recorded activities in the AVNI app via mobile phones.
- Farmers reported improved agricultural productivity, and desilted ponds retained sufficient water during summer.
- Mr. Rajeev Singh (Sr. Prog. Manager, NBJK) and farmers Mr. Vijay Kumar and Mr. Kedar Mahto shared insights on farmer mobilization, challenges, and silt management strategies at a dissemination workshop organized by ATE Chandra Foundation and NITI Aayog in New Delhi on 12 Feb'24.



06. Young India Mission Rozgar Support: UTI Mutual Fund

- A project focused on skill development training for disadvantaged youths in various trades to tackle issues related to livelihood, unemployment, forced migration, and socio-economic enhancement.
- Features well-equipped training centers, experienced faculties, technical expertise, practical classes, placement/self-employment assistance, sustainable livelihood opportunities, entry-level job training, and the development of skilled human resources for business houses and industries.
- Young India Mission Rozgar Training Centers located in Hazaribagh, Giridih, and Koderma offer 03-month skill development courses in trades such as Basic Computer Applications, General Duty/Nursing Assistance, Beautician-Mehndi-Bridal Makeup, Tailoring-Embroidery, and Tally-Accountancy.
- Support activities include mobilizing aspirant youths for enrollment, branding the program through free medical health checkup camps, providing counseling, mid-course exposure, motivational guest lectures, on-the-job training, employers' meets, alumni meetings, certification ceremonies, etc.
- Printing and distribution of trainees' handbooks for all trades to enhance the qualitative learning process and ensure clear understanding.
- From April to June 2023, training was provided to a total of 343 youths, with 159 successfully placed in jobs.



07. Usha Silai School Support: Usha International Limited, SIDBI & Individual Donors

- To empower rural women in Jharkhand and Bihar as entrepreneurs, the program provides comprehensive training in tailoring, sewing machine maintenance, life skills, and all necessary resources to establish Usha Silai Schools in their villages.
- 10 training events spanning a total of 90 days were conducted for 116 women under the Usha Classical Silai School segment at the districts participants wise - Saraikeela Kharsawan (15), West Singhbhum (15), Ramgarh (10), Lakhisarai (15), Sahebganj (25), East Singhbhum (25), Giridih (02), Hazaribagh (07), Aurangabad (01) and again in Hazaribagh (01).
- Under the Usha Classical Silai School segment, each trainee completed a 9-day residential training program and received a new sewing machine, a service manual, a syllabus, a guidebook, a signage board, and a course completion certificate.
- 04 residential Satellite Silai School training events, totaling 08 days, were held for 100 women at the following locations with number of trainees like at Godda (30), Ranchi (30), Giridih (20) and Gaya (20).
- A total of 883 Usha Silai Schools and 657 Usha Satellite Schools have been established in 47 districts of Jharkhand and Bihar, providing direct employment to 1,540 women from villages. Each woman earns an average monthly income of Rs. 5,000-10,000.



08. Micro Enterprise Promotion Program

Support: Small Industries Development Bank of India-SIDBI

- The initiative aims to transform youth from "job-seekers" to "job-providers" by promoting viable enterprises in rural, semi-urban, and artisan-based clusters through employment generation and livelihood creation, offering support in identifying opportunities, capacity building, resource mobilization, marketing, financial linkages, and customer relations, while addressing urban migration by commercially exploiting local resources and know-how.
- Coverage of Hazaribagh, Ramgarh, Giridih, Khunti and West Singhbhum districts in Jharkhand.
- MEPP started in October 2023 and within the period of six months only, it has promoted 155 units by facilitating credit linkage with Nationalized Banks/Regional Rural Bank/Small Finance Bank/NBFC/MFI etc.

- These units have investment of more than Rs. 50,000 for each through credit linkage and sustainability in the long run.
- The program has covered service sector enterprises also, developed total 96 existing units and 59 new units.
- It helped to create 217 employment opportunities for youths across five operational districts and apart from direct employment, the business also creates opportunities for the business indirectly.
- Ensured training support to beneficiaries in the trades like tailoring, mechanic & other skills through liaisoning with Entrepreneur Development Program, Rural Self Employment Training Institutes and other Skill Training Departments.
- Employment generation and creation of business opportunities by promoting small scale industries in non-farm sector, most of the beneficiaries come from rural areas those started their own business and improved quality of lives through better earnings.
- Self-reliance and women empowerment as 100 units are women led out of 155 promoted units under the program.



CASE STORY Mannu Thakur's Empowerment



Mannu Kumar Thakur, a 35-year-old barber from Village-Adarsh Nagar, Bengabad (Giridih, Jharkhand), faced the daunting task of supporting his family of six with no ancestral property. Despite the challenges, Mannu embraced barbering, following his father's footsteps, to make ends meet. His days were spent servicing his father's clients in villages, while evenings saw him working at a local barber's shop in Bengabad.

A chance encounter with an NBJK field staff member brought a ray of hope into Mannu's life. Expressing his desire to open his own barber shop, Mannu received support through the SIDBI-NBJK Micro Enterprise Promotion Program. With a Rs. 60,000 loan from Samasta Microfinance Ltd., Mannu established his shop at Bengabad market in November 2023, bolstered by his family's support and contributions from relatives.

Mannu's skills and dedication quickly garnered popularity, enabling him to earn between Rs. 700-1000 daily. As demand surged, Mannu expanded his business, hiring an assistant and improving infrastructure. Today, Mannu's barber shop stands as a symbol of success, providing stability and prosperity for his family.

Grateful for the support from NBJK and SIDBI, Mannu reflects on his journey with profound gratitude, now able to provide for his family's needs, ensure his children's education, and care for his elderly parents. Mannu's story highlights the transformative power of entrepreneurship and resilience in the face of adversity.

09. Mission Rozgar Support: SBI Life Insurance Co. Ltd.

- To reduce unemployment and prevent forced migration among 220 marginalized youths in Jharkhand by offering six months of vocational and soft skills training. This initiative aims to foster sustainable livelihoods through job placements and entrepreneurship development, providing skilled manpower to businesses and industries.
- Operational in slum areas of Hazaribagh Township and villages in Katkamsandi, Katkamdag, Ichak, Barkagaon, Daru, Padma, and other neighboring blocks of Hazaribagh district.
- Conducted three months of training in two batches for 232 youths in various trades including Basic Computer Applications (BCA), General Duty Attendant (GDA), Beautician-Bridal Makeup & Mehendi, and Tailoring-cum-Embroidery.
- Youth mobilization through road shows, door-to-door meetings, and community meetings.
- Guest lectures, exposure visits, employers' meets, alumni meetings, job fairs, and training of trainers.
- Training in BCA - 61 youths, GDA - 63 youths, Beautician - 61 youths & Tailoring - 47 youths.
- Approximately 70% of trained youths secured positions in renowned businesses, healthcare units, beauty parlors, academic institutions, malls, and marts.
- 90% of the trained youths are adolescent girls and women, promoting women empowerment.
- Job fairs and employers' meet facilitated youth alignment with the competitive job market, enabling entry-level job absorption.
- Employment of disadvantaged youths in entry-level jobs has uplifted the socio-economic status of their families.
- Increased availability of domestic jobs has curbed the migration rate.
- Visit of Mr. Dinesh R. (Regional Director, SBI Life) with other senior officials, who honored Mission Rozgar trainees with course completion certificates on 16 March 2024.



CASE STORY Amar's Journey to Employment and Change



Amar Kumar, a 25-year-old from Bada Bazar, Hazaribagh, faced a challenging situation when his father Mahesh Prasad Gupta, the sole breadwinner of their seven-member family, passed away. His death left the family without an income source. Without a college education, Amar struggled to find employment.

One day, a pamphlet about the Mission Rozgar program, sponsored by SBI Life and executed by Nav Bharat Jagriti Kendra, caught his eye. Recognizing these names, Amar visited the training center, met the faculty, and gathered information about the courses. After consulting his family and friends, he enrolled in Basic Computer Applications.

Amar dedicated himself to the three-month training, understanding the necessity of a job to support his family. Upon completing the program, he was informed about an interview for a Computer Operator-cum-Cashier position at Apna Mart, Hazaribagh. Amar attended the interview and secured the job, earning Rs. 10,000 per month.

Reflecting on his experience, Amar says, "This break has saved me from migrating to big cities; I am with my family and can look after my mother and sisters." The Mission Rozgar program not only provided him with skills but also the opportunity to stay with his loved ones and support them.

10. Poverty Reduction through Self-Help Groups (Self-Sustainable)

- Since 1991, NBJK has been organizing women and focusing on their socio-economic development through this program.
- The initiative spans 12 blocks in Hazaribagh, Ramgarh, Ranchi, and Khunti districts of Jharkhand, as well as 15 slum areas in Patna, Bihar.
- Women are organized into Self-Help Groups (SHGs), while men form Joint Liability Groups (JLGs). Responsibilities are managed by group office bearers.
- SHGs and JLGs hold regular meetings, ensure internal savings, and the group members support each other in promoting livelihood activities.
- The program provides doorstep microcredit services, processing and monitoring minor businesses or income generation activities.
- There are a total of 745 SHGs with 14,794 members. Microcredit has been provided to 5,764 members of 610 SHGs. Additionally, there are 288 loanee JLGs with 1,211 borrower members.
- The cumulative recovery rate is around 90%, with lower returns from Khunti district due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The program directly supports 6,975 families, with 83% of the breadwinners being women, contributing significantly to women's empowerment on a large scale.



SUPPORT TO SMALL INITIATIVES

01. Community Action – Small Groups (Support: Action Village India)

- To mainstream marginalized communities through initiatives upon education, livelihood, environment conservation and awareness upon social issues.
- A collective effort by NBJK with three grassroots small organizations viz. Lok Shakti Shikshan Kendra, Paraiya (Gaya), Gram Nirman Kendra, Wazirganj (Gaya) and Lok Prerna Kendra, Simariya (Chatra).
- Lok Shakti Shikshan Kendra (LSSK) has focused upon a small village called Lenin Nagar with 85 households of most deprived Musahar community, runs a non-formal education center there for 30 girl children, ensured their admission in a nearby formal school and mobilized the villagers against Child Marriage.
- LSSK has addressed water crisis in the village through a borewell with motor pump, it provided fruits plants of mango & guava to inhabitants and facilitated small scale farming to raise their income.
- Gram Nirman Kendra (GNK) has initiated Nursery development activity and opted plantation as a campaign in villages.
- GNK has prepared 2650 plants of Teak, Sheesham, Semal, Papaya, Guava etc. and distributed in villages.
- Lok Prerna Kendra (LPK) runs a Community School among Birhor people at village-Piri in Simariya block. 26 children (girls 11 & boys 15) are enrolled here for basic learning. 04 pass out children got admission in a local government school.
- The program covers most vulnerable section of society including Musahar, Manjhi and Birhor communities. The Birhors, in particular, are on the verge of extinction.



PEOPLE'S ACTION, NETWORKING & GOVERNANCE

01. Lok Samiti

Support: Jannalal Bajaj Foundation, Action Village India, NBJK & Likeminded VOs of Bihar-Jharkhand)

- Lok Samiti is a non-political and non-registered people's organization founded on June 30, 1977, by renowned freedom fighter and Sarvodaya leader Loknayak Jay Prakash Narayan (JP). It upholds the Gandhian principles of non-violence, peace, and harmony to tackle a wide range of socio-economic issues affecting women, youth, farmers, laborers, and others.
- On its 46th Foundation Day, Lok Samiti held a Volunteer Honor Ceremony at the NBJK Coordination Office in Hazaribagh, where the organization's national president, Mr. Girija Satish, honored senior members Mr. Neeti Bhai (Varanasi) and Mr. Sanwaliya Giri (Chhapra).
- Mr. Girija Satish participated in an anti-liquor convention with Union Minister of Tribal Affairs, Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare, Mr. Arjun Munda, at Kharsawan on April 2, 2023. Additional events included a seminar on "Prohibition in Religions" at Hazaribagh on April 20, 2023, and a PAN India Liquor Ban Convention at Bhawanipatna on February 25, 2024.
- A Farmer-Labor Convention was held in Bodhgaya on May 25, 2023, featuring Mr. Jitan Ram Manjhi (Former Chief Minister, Bihar) and Mrs. Jyoti Manjhi (MLA, Barachatti), addressing demands for MSP, APMC, fair wages, land for the landless, agricultural subsidies, and irrigation system repairs.
- Key events included a seminar on "Memories of Emergency 25 June 1975" at Hazaribagh on June 26, 2023, the commemoration of Mahatma Gandhi's 154th birth anniversary at Hazaribagh on October 2, 2023, a Women's Conference at Bodhgaya on October 29, 2023, a tribute on Mahatma Gandhi's Martyrdom Day at Patna on January 30, 2024, and the celebration of 50 years of the JP Movement at Hazaribagh on March 18, 2024.
- A total of 4,872 delegates, about 70% of whom were women, participated peacefully in 21 events including conferences, meetings, rallies, seminars, symposiums, conventions, fasting, and special day observances across 15 locations in Jharkhand, Bihar, and Odisha.



02. Family Counseling Center

Support: Central Social Welfare Board & Jharkhand State Social Welfare Board

- An initiative across 06 blocks of Hazaribagh district to settle family disputes through counseling and guidance.
- Registered 142 cases as dowry demand (12), extra-marital relation (18), domestic violence (33), alcoholism (18), marital dispute (40), property dispute (08) and others (13). Cases solved (95) and pending (47).
- The program monitored by a sub-committee with members from PRIs, enlightened citizenry and legal fraternity.



CASE STORY

A Successful Reconciliation

Ajay Kumar, 30, son of Mr. Suresh Bhagat from Masratu village, Katkamdag block, Hazaribagh district, sought help from the Family Counseling Center (FCC) in early March 2024. He submitted an application concerning a marital dispute with his wife, Shobha Devi, daughter of Mr. Suresh Mali from Jarmune village, Bagodar block, Giridih district. Their marriage, now two years old, began peacefully but soon turned tumultuous as Shobha started quarreling and eventually left to stay with her parents.



Ajay complained that Shobha's mistrust and suspicion of an extra-marital affair, which he vehemently denied, led to frequent arguments. His inability to convince her of his fidelity, coupled with taunting and teasing, exacerbated the situation. The counselors at FCC discovered that the primary issues stemmed from a lack of mutual understanding, mistrust, and unwanted parental intervention from both sides.

Through home visits and separate personal meetings, the counselors worked diligently, conducting numerous counseling sessions. On March 18, 2024, a family meeting was held with members from both families, where the dispute was settled unanimously. Follow-up visits by the counselors ensured a peaceful reconciliation, marking a hopeful new chapter for Ajay and Shobha. This case exemplifies the power of communication and professional intervention in resolving marital conflicts.
