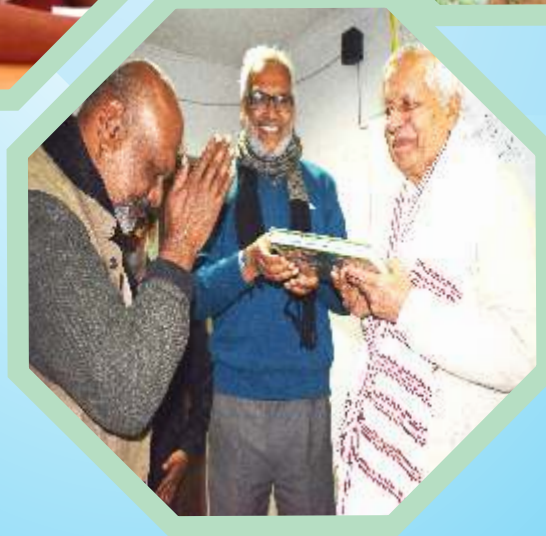

From the Secretary's desk.....



We are happy to inform NBJK entering into the 51st year of Rural Development. Due to Covid, we could not celebrate our Golden Jubilee year. Also, so many people died in the 2nd wave of Covid, that it was not the year to celebrate, but to put our energy and resources in Covid Relief work- which we successfully did by converting our school & hospital as Migrant workers quarantine centers and Oxygen supported 30 bedded Covid Care Centre. We provided relief to over 1,70,000 covid affected people by way of food-packets, cash transaction in the account of affected families, masks distribution, providing oximeters, infra-red thermometers, vaporizer steam-pots, running free-kitchens, awareness meetings & IEC materials display, smart phones to poor students, free health camps & free medicines in villages of Hazaribagh, Gaya, Chatra, Ranchi, Khunti, Bokaro and Patna districts etc. We also supported the government hospitals and rural medical practitioners with sanitizers, masks, PPE kits and infra-red thermometers etc., who were having lack of such supplies. Support from our MP Shri Jayant Sinha Ji in mobilizing the Covid Relief Resources from different corporate houses had been very valuable and remarkable. In this crucial time, a mobile medical van also got started under the Sanjiveeni project in Gaya district for regular medical health camps on monthly basis in villages for the poor people who could not afford or able to go to cities.

2021-22 have been the historical year for NBJK, establishing fourth unit of LNJP Eye Hospital as Vimla Ramkrishna Bajaj Eye Hospital at Deoghar (Jharkhand), inaugurated on 10th October 2021. This is a 30 bedded modern eye hospital which covers 22 blocks of 5 districts in Bihar-Jharkhand. Additionally, 4 new Vision Centers have been initiated as 3 in remote blocks like Keredari, Badkagaon and Barkattha of Hazaribagh district and 1 at Gaya city. We strengthened LNJPEH, Bahera with a new ambulance and a new Retina Surgery Unit with Vitrectomy machine while LNJPEH, Dumka has installed a new OCT machine for quality eye care facility to people. Also, LNJP Paramedical Institute which offers 2 years Diploma course of Ophthalmic Assistant completed successfully to develop human resource needed for eye care sector.

On front of pro children & educational intervention, we worked with more than 10,000 children overall. Besides our schools & pre-existing Remedial Coaching Centers, 139 smart phones were distributed amongst poor children for virtual classes in the lockdown period, 30 new Remedial Coaching Centers established for high-school girl children in villages of Hazaribagh. Educational improvement reflected as 100% result in class X board exam and 71% students passed with 1st division.



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In the field of livelihood & entrepreneurship development, Murhu Nari Shakti Kisan Producer Co. Ltd., an FPO promoted under Lakhpati Kisan program in Khunti district, won two prestigious awards this year. MNSKPCL established Lac Handicraft Unit, contributes to Jal Jeevan Mission in villages and facilitated several rural entrepreneurs in this tribal area. Three vocational Rozgar Training Centers at Hazaribagh, Koderma & Giridih got re-established for youths' skill development as well as ensures their placement too under Young India Project. NBJK has been advocating around Liquor Prohibition constantly and organized mass conventions in many districts of Jharkhand.

But the year has been also a year of big setback for NBJK, as we lost our Founder Member and Treasurer Shri Prabhu Nath Sharma on 19th January 2022 due to heart attack, who has served the community for 50 years with full dedication and honesty.

Last but not the least; we do mention that NBJK is nothing but an embodiment of the help, co-operation and support from our mentors, invaluable donors, funding agencies, friends, staffs & the community above all. On behalf of the organization, I pay sincere gratitude and heartfelt thanks to all of them.

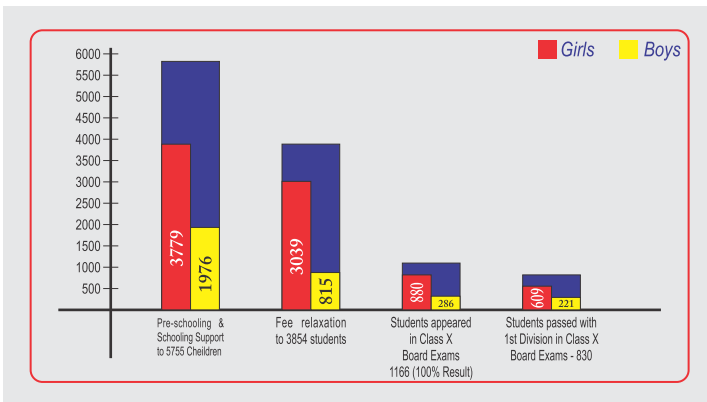

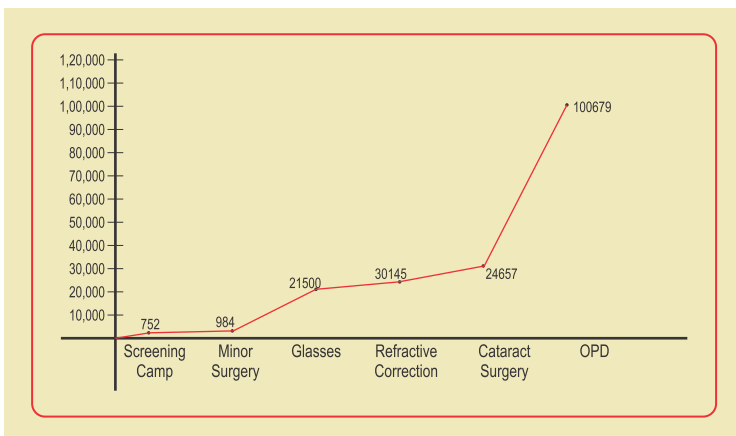
Annual Highlights

- Pre-schooling & Schooling Support to 5755 Children (3779 girls, 1976 boys), Fees relaxation or free ship to 3854 students (3039 girls, 815 boys). 1166 Students (880 girls, 286 boys) appeared for class 10 board exam, 100% Result, 830 students (609 girls, 221 boys) passed with 1st Division.
- Worked with 10655 children through schools, education centers and other child friendly projects.
- Provided Smart phones to 139 school children (129 girls, 10 boys) to attend online classes.

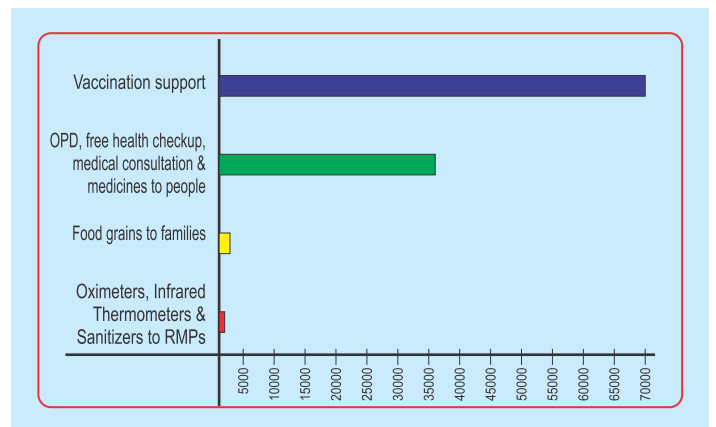

beds with Oxygen support, saved lives of 35 serious patients.

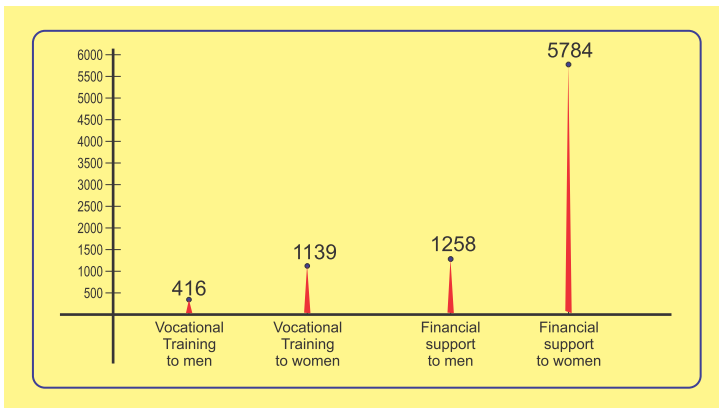

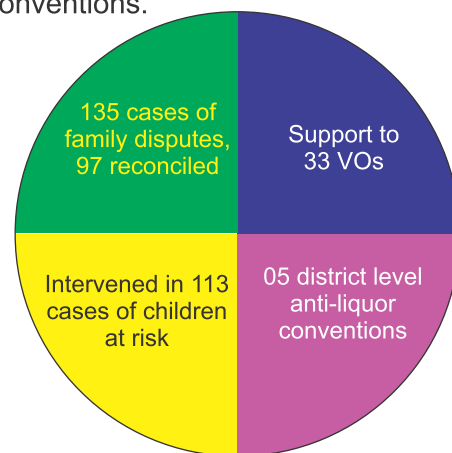

Education



1. Amoli Apurva Primary School (Support: NBJK, Mission Every Girl in School-GiveIndia, No Hungry Child)



- At village-Prajapat Nagar in Chauparan block of Hazaribagh district, coverage of 07 neighbouring villages.
- Classes from Nursery to VI, total students-150 (girls-78, boys-72), fee relaxation/waived for 14 students (girls-08, boys-06), play way education, CBSE syllabus, Hindi medium of instruction, earned good reputation among parents/guardians.
- Covid relief materials distributed among the students.
- Many former students are doing well; one Shekhar Kumar from Prajapat Nagar village now plays Rajasthan Champions Trophy.

2. Amoli Apurva Middle School (Support: NBJK, Smt. Amoli & Shri Apurva, Ahmedabad & Local Community)



- At village-Bahera in Chauparan block of Hazaribagh district, coverage of 05 nearby villages, U-DISE Code-20040515906, School Code-210284.
- Classes from I to VIII, total students-209 (girls-112, boys-97), JCERT syllabus, Hindi medium instruction, 20 students passed in class 8 board examination.
- Nominal affordable fee structure from Rs. 30 to Rs. 50 only, 84 students (girls-64, boys-20) from class I to V pay Rs. 10 only.
- Playground, toilets, safe drinking water, regular PT, outdoor & indoor games facility for children.



3. Amoli Apurva High School (Support: NBJK, Smt. Surekha & Shri Prakashbhai Shah, Ahmedabad, GiveIndia Donors & Local Community)



- At village-Mangarh in Chauparan block of Hazaribagh district, coverage of 18 villages from Chauparan & Mayurhand blocks under Hazaribagh and Chatra districts respectively.
- Classes from VI to X, affiliation with Jharkhand Academic Council-Ranchi, Total enrollment-510 (girls-231, boys-279).
- Organized extra-curricular activities like sports-speech-debate competitions, annual day, cultural events etc. and distributed 40 smart phones to girl students.
- Freeship/Fees relaxation for 24 students (girls-11, boys-13).
- 135 students (girls-75, boys-60) appeared for class X board examination and passed as 107 (girls-61, boys-46) with 1st division, 27 (girls-13, boys-14) with 2nd division and 01 (girl-01) with 3rd division, 100% result.

4. Chandrakala Devi Daga High School (Support: NBJK, GiveIndia, Danamojo & Individual Donors)



- At-village Kewaliya in Chauparan block of Hazaribagh

district, coverage of 20 adjacent villages e.g. Karma, Jiyachak, Ambajit etc.

- Classes from VI to X, total students-353 (girls-223, boys-130), all girls & 32 boys avail sponsorship for school education. Most of the students come from lower socio-economic strata.
- Active participation of over 100 students in extra-curricular activities like sports & cultural events, distribution of prizes, gifts, awards & 40 smartphones etc among them.
- 83 students (girls-53, boys-30) took the exam of class X board and passed as 66 (girls-38, boys-28) with 1st division, 16 (girls-14, boys-02) with 2nd division and 01 (girl-01) with 3rd division, 100% result.
- Follows syllabus & guidelines of Jharkhand Academic Council, Ranchi.
- A leading school promoting girl child education and abandoned child marriage in this backward area.

5. Roshni Dhruva High School (Support: Smt. Roshni & Shri Dhruva Shah, Ahmedabad & Local Community)



- At village-Nagri in Churchu block of Hazaribagh district, coverage of around 39 villages from Churchu and Daru blocks in Hazaribagh district while some covered villages fall under Mandu block of Ramgarh district.
- Co-education, classes from VI to X, total 246 students (girls-107, boys-139), partial fees relaxation for 25 students (girls-15, boys-10) belong to poor families.
- Visits by Mr. Gandharv Gaurav (Secretary, RDHS Managing Committee) who provided proper guidance for school's development and special preparation for students lagging behind academically because of 2nd wave of Covid.

- Keeping view of the need of online learning, with support of Amazon's Delivering Smile Campaign & GiveIndia, mobile phones made available to 39 girl students from low income group families. Mr. Indradev Rajwar (Officer In-charge, Churchu PS) handed over Smart Phones to the girls.
- 55 students (girls-26, boys-29) appeared for class X board examination by JAC, 98% result as 29 (girls-12, boys-17) with 1st division, 19 (girls-09, boys-10) with 2nd division, 06 (girls-04, boys-02) with 3rd division and 01 girl failed.

6. Birsa Public School (Support: Action Village India, U. K. & Local Community)



- At village-Devkuli in Ichak block of Hazaribagh district, coverage of 07 remote villages and prefers girls to ensure their schooling.
- Classes from Nursery to X, total enrollment 142 (girls-108, boys-34), 95 girls from weaker section avail sponsorship facility for their school education.
- Co-curricular activities, big campus, drinking water & separate toilets. School girls contributed in making of a short documentary film over road problem they face to attend the school.
- 36 (girls-26, boys-10) students appeared for class X board examination by JAC-Jharkhand, 100% result, 31 (girls-25, boys-06) passed with 1st division and 05 (girl-01, boys-04) with 2nd division.

7. Surekha Prakash Bhai Public School (Support: Local Community)

- At village-Bahera in Chauparan block of Hazaribagh district, coverage of 125 villages from Chauparan,



Itkhori & Mayurhand blocks of Hazaribagh and Chatra districts.

- Spacious campus, rich infrastructure, CBSE affiliation, Nursery-XII classes, quality education, 1009 students (girls-409, boys-600).
- Around 50% students (girls-204, boys-300) with fees relaxation and 57 students (girls-35, boys-22) with scholarship.
- Conducted online classes for every student during school closure because of Covid pandemic and organized online course preparative quiz contest for students of classVI-X to compensate their academic loss.
- Ms. Shruti Suman, class XII student of 2021 batch has secured 90% marks in AISSCE and became state topper of NEET. Likewise Mr. Manish Kumar Mishra, another alumnus has joined Indian Air Force as an officer.
- As 100% result of class X Board Examination, 11 students (04 Girls, 07 Boys) came out with 90% and above marks. Nitesh Kr. Gupta (97%) as the topper, while 154 (53 Girls, 101 Boys) ranged from 60% - 89% and 38 (12 Girls, 26 Boys) got below 60% marks out of a total of 203 (69 Girls, 134 Boys) students.
- For Class XII of Science and Commerce Streams, 42 students (19 Girls, 23 Boys) appeared in the exam, 100% Result, Ishika Jain of Commerce stream achieved 97% and Bittu Raj from Science Stream secured 94% marks as School Toppers. From both the streams, total 08 (3 Girls, 5 Boys) achieved 90% and above, 17 (07 Girls, 10 Boys) fetched 80% and above, 16 (9 Girls, 7 Boys) obtained 70% and above with 1 boy as the recipient of more than 50% marks.



8. Komal Pujan Public School (Support: Shri Prakashbhai Shah, Shri Bhawinbhai Shah & Family, Ahmedabad)



- At village-Silaunja near Bodhgaya in Gaya district of Bihar, coverage of 51 villages from Bodhgaya and Mohanpur blocks of the district, offers low cost quality education for children of remote rural areas.
- Classes from Nursery to X, total 350 students (girls-131, boys-219), CBSE pattern, English medium, ICT mode of teaching, computer education, smart classes.
- Focus on co-curricular activities, sports & music, counselling facility, proper attention over weak students, no fees for 10 (girls-4, boys-6) students, distributed 20 smart phones among students.
- Up to class IX, overall result is quite impressive as 70% children got 90% marks, 10% students fetched 80% marks, 10% students gained 60% to 70% marks and 10% could get below 50% marks.
- Well-to-do infrastructure, library, playground & healthy milieu for all-round development of children.
- 11 students (6 girls, 5 boys) appeared for class X board examination through CBSE, 100% result.

9. Remedial Coaching Centers (Support: UTI Mutual Fund, Mumbai)

- To prepare school girls of class VIII, IX & X in villages for better academic performance through extra tuition on subjects like Science, English & Maths at Remedial Coaching Centers.
- 30 RCCs with 1077 students (girls-90% plus) across villages in Sadar, Daru and Churchu blocks of Hazaribagh district.
- Provides free of cost coaching for two & half hours before or after school time as per convenience of



students on every working day.

- At each center, a competent teacher takes classes and facilitates the students to take interest in above mentioned subjects.
- The endeavor helps children from not only the village where RCC is located but many others from nearby villages also.
- Such facility matters a lot in rural areas where girl children are unable to get tuition at distant places because of financial problem, communication shortage and social restrictions.
- 280 students (girls-262, boys-18) appeared for class X board examination and passed as 212 (girls-196, boys-16) with 1st division, 59 (girls-57, boys-02) with 2nd division, 05 (all girls) with 3rd division and 04 (all girls) as marginal.

10. Girls' Education & Coaching Centers (Support: Action Village India, U. K.)



- To uplift academic level of girls, to get rid of gender disparity and child marriage at villages.
- Sponsored educational expenditures for 391 girls from class III to graduation in Hazaribagh, Chatra, Ranchi, Dumka and Gaya districts of Jharkhand-Bihar.
- Such 103 girl children appeared for class X board exam. Out of 89 under State Boards, 32 passed with



Fuelling Hope for Future

Warisha Parveen of village-Pauta, Sadar block, Hazaribagh, is third among five daughters of her parents. She has no brother, her mother Mrs. Mariyam Khatoon is a housewife and father Md. Mahfooz Alam is a labour who is only earning member of this 7-members family.

Warisha is a student of Birsa School, Marheta near her village and sometimes it was difficult for her to pay school fees even due to financial problem. During the year 2019-20, she was in class VIII and like many other students, had problem with subjects like Maths, Science & English.



When NBJK-AVI started a Remedial Coaching Centre at Marheta, she became happy as it was not easy for her to get extra tuition because of poverty and distant tutor. She joined RCC and put hard work to cover her syllabus. In class VIII, Warisha earned A+ grade in board exam and promoted to class IX. Due to Covid pandemic,

board exam didn't take place in year 20-21 and keeping view of her last result she was promoted to class X. Now Warisha has appeared for class X board exam and achieved 93% marks including 100% in Maths.

She says that regular study, daily homework and weekly-monthly tests at RCC motivated her to do better. Also she appreciates the activities like quiz & parents-teacher meeting by the centre for inculcating interest towards study.

During Covid period too, these RCCs have conducted offline classes on most of the days and masks & sanitizer were arranged for students & teachers at each centre.

Warisha wants to be a doctor and plans to continue +2 with science. She is passionate to serve poor people and her parents.

1st division, 42 with 2nd division and 06 with 3rd division. 09 girls could not attend exams due to health or other reasons and are preparing for supplementary exam. 14 girls through CBSE have resulted as 10 with 1st division and 04 with 2nd division.

- Supported 660 girl students of class VIII, IX & X with free of cost extra tuition on comparatively tough subjects like English, Science & Maths at 17 Remedial Coaching Centres at villages in Sadar, Katkamdag and Katkamsandi blocks of Hazaribagh district. 206 girls appeared for class X board exam and succeeded as 148 with 1st division, 55 with 2nd division and 02 with 3rd division while 01 girl couldn't pass. 99.5% result.
- Monthly review meetings with RCCs' teachers and monthly test of students to monitor their individual subject wise progress.
- RCCs' teachers have been provided 02 times Orientation Training focused upon academic compensation due to disturbance by Covid pandemic, modified syllabus and new strategy for simplifying contents towards better output by students.
- Each RCC has organized Quiz Competition for their students and ensured prize for every participant.
- Active involvement of parents during Parents-Teacher Meeting held at RCCs, they shown concern over their ward's progress and awareness on the issues like girls' education, gender equality as well as no child marriage.

11. Lord Buddha Home for Children (Support: Prakashbhai Shah, Stitching Kinderhulp Bodhgaya, the Netherlands)



- A free residential setup with food, cloth, education for destitute & orphan children at village-Silaunja near Bodhgaya (Gaya, Bihar).
- Currently 38 children (girls-18, boys-20) live here and



they belong to 34 villages of 17 blocks from 3 districts of Bihar-Jharkhand.

- The children get quality schooling at NBJK's Komal Pujan Public School in the same premises, 06 children appeared for class X board examination through CBSE.
- The alumni of LBHC are performing better as 03 have joined engineering colleges, 05 are learning technical trades of electrician & fitter at ITI, 11 are getting college education in arts, science & commerce streams, 05 are in jobs while 07 have left the campus with their legal guardians to pursue better education as per their choice.
- During second deadly wave of Covid, the management ensured preventive measures and kept all children safe.
- Observance of International Yoga Day and a group of children demonstrated Pranayam, Anulom-Vilom, many Asans and meditation. On World Environment Day, the children have planted 19 plants of 13 varieties and took oath to protect these plants.
- Inner Wheel gaya City club members distributed play kits among the children and Mr. Sandeep Agrawal, Gaya has donated clothes & blankets for them.

12. Child Reporters (Support: UNICEF Jharkhand)

- An exclusive program on child rights with special focus on Covid-19 vaccine rollout for trust building and bursting myths, nutrition services and ending child marriage.
- Coverage of 60 Government middle schools across 06 blocks of Ranchi district in Jharkhand, selection of 1677 Child Reporters (girls-1059, boys-618).
- To make teachers & students aware about Covid vaccine and to facilitate smooth implementation of



vaccination drive by bursting myths through training. To ensure awareness among children about preventive health/nutrition & hygiene at individual-family-social level, upon child rights including social evil of child marriage, Govt. schemes, to promote Child Reporters' interaction with other children as well as influencers to amplify their voice and to make them vocal.

- District level capacity building workshop of teachers, BEEOs, BPOs on issues of Child Rights & Climate Change, total participants-78.
- Physically & Online Thematic capacity building sessions with 8056 children (girls-1097, boys-3047) in 60 schools.
- Child Reporters Quiz at school level, 60 quiz events with 1678 children (girls-1097, boys-581).
- 07 Bal Charcha by 111 (girls-82, boys-29) Child Reporters on child rights with 38 (females-16, males-22) elected representatives/Govt. Officials/Media Persons.
- 07 Learning Visits to Anganwadi Centre/Health Sub-Centre/Police Station/Media House by 107 Child Reporters (girls-83, boys-24), met 30 (females-14, males-16) responsible persons.
- Participation of 910 Child Reporters (girls-614, boys-296) in 11 Cluster Level Activities like sports, slogan writing, story/poem reading & speech, contribution of 122 (female-71, male-51) teachers & community people.

Myself Child Reporter Deepa Kumari, a student of class VII at Government Middle School, Tetri in Namkum block of Ranchi district. Ever since I joined Child Reporters program, many new domains of knowledge like child rights, their realization, application etc have enriched me. These includes various important issues as child marriage, child labour, life amid Covid with preventive measures, vaccination and now about a new vaccination drive for children of 15-18 years age group.

In my family, all adult persons are already vaccinated. Since I didn't reach up to 15 years of age, this new vaccine is not for me but I was concerned about my elder brother and calculated his age. He is 17 years old.

One day I asked him whether he took the vaccine or not? He denied and declared that he wouldn't take any vaccine as many have died after vaccination! His bizarre logic made me stunned. This was a big challenge to persuade him but I referred about Child Reporters program which taught us about benefits of anti-covid vaccine. Also I told him that deaths of people are caused by other diseases as many vaccinated persons are still alive around us, so don't blame vaccine and please get vaccinated soon. After some hot exchanges, my brother agreed and went to take vaccine.

I am very satisfied that he accepted my point and got vaccinated. The credit goes to Child Reporters program. The program motivated us to make people aware of vaccination. We do this in our family & neighborhood. Also Mamta, a friend Child Reporter did the same and convinced her old aged grandma to be vaccinated. We are proud to be Child Reporters!!

- Identification of CwDs, their certification, UDID card making, aids & appliances, physiotherapy, corrective surgery. Certification-110, corrective surgery-05, physiotherapy-26.
- Intervention for street children, deaddiction & school enrollment campaign, Covid prevention awareness drive.
- Vocational training for youths in trades of Tailoring (50, all females), Beautician (110, all females) and Basic



Computer Applications (60, females-20 & males-40).
Total 2385 youths (females-1670 & males-715) trained

and 963 youths (females-577 & males-386) placed
during project period.

Keeping Steps to Independence

Divyanshu Kumar is only 6 years old. He lives with his parents Mrs. Madhvi Sinha and Mr. Sanjay Sinha at Mogalpura slum locality of Patna. Divyanshu was unable to walk or even sit properly as his both legs are polio stricken.

Team Sakcham identified him during a survey. The child comes from a poor family, his father is daily wager and mother lives in home. The parents couldn't make disability certificate for their physically challenged son and Sakcham staffs have initiated required process. In that course, when they took the child to Patna Medical College & Hospital, concerned doctors assured for recovery. After proper assessment, the doctors did corrective surgery and Sakcham provided financial support of Rs. 2000 for the purpose.

After surgery, physiotherapy started and the project's special educator ensured his therapy on regular basis. That brought positive changes for Divyanshu. He started walking with support. Soon he got a pair of calipers and now can walk himself, does his routine works as well as helps his mother to accomplish petty jobs.

When Divyanshu was presented to the doctors for review checkup, they admitted him for 8 days again, provided special physiotherapy & shoes. Now Divyanshu is far better and the parents are happy.

LNJP Paramedical Institute Enables Youths to Serve & Earn with Dignity

Mr. Bhim Kumar is a student with 2 years diploma course of Ophthalmic Assistance by LNJP Paramedical Institute. LNJPPI is being run by LNJP Eye Hospital, Bahera. Now he has completed 3rd semester of the course.

Before joining the course, Bhim has passed through many zigzags of life as he comes from a poor family. He belongs to Village-Singhagathiya, Post-Sahiya, PS-Wazirganj, Dist-Gaya (Bihar) and lost his father Mr. Babulal Sharma around 6 years back. He has two elder brothers but they live separately with their families. His widow mother Mrs. Saro Devi works as a cook at local Primary School. But from very beginning she encouraged Bhim to study and to move forward.

This made him to complete graduation and to get any livelihood after death of his father. Bhim worked as a village level worker with an NGO and started providing home tuition to children additionally.

In early days of the year 2020, one of his friends informed him about the course of Ophthalmic Assistance by LNJPPI and Bhim decided to join that with determination. Since it's a residential training course and costs around Rs. 01 lakh, he invested his hard-earned cash.

But Bhim never looked back and tried to learn new skills with full sincerity. Now he became proficient in Retinoscopy, Slitlamp Examination, Auto Refraction, Vision Assessment, Refraction, IOL power calculation, Perimetry, Peribulbar Anaesthesia, OT Assistance etc. Besides regular classes, he attended cataract and school eye screening camps in remote areas for exposure & new learning.

This quest for knowledge & practical application helped to develop his personality, Mr. Vikant Singh (Principal, LNJPPI) says.

After completion of this diploma course, Bhim will get a job of minimum Rs. 15,000-20,000 per month very easily in Jharkhand or Bihar and can get Rs. 50,000-60,000 per month after some experience. He is aware of this change going to take place in his life shortly as his course will be completed in November 2022.

Cataract Surgery Made Lives Thankful

Mrs. Shanti Devi, husband-Mr. Meghlal Ray hails from village-Kachhail, block-Gandey, district-Giridih (Jharkhand). As a poor socio-economic family background of this middle aged couple was not enough for their suffering, the husband is physically challenged and Shanti herself got cataract in her eyes. Though Shanti & Meghlal have four sons but unfortunately they don't take proper care of their parents.

Visually impaired Shanti found it very difficult to accomplish own routine works and became completely helpless to support her husband she used to take care since long. Also their financial condition was bad.

Shanti Devi's cataract was identified during a free Eye Screening Camp held in her locality organized with support of Sightsavers in the month of October 2021 and it has been removed through a surgery at Vimla Ramkrishna Bajaj Eye Hospital, Deoghar. That restored Shanti Devi's vision successfully and enabled her to resume daily course of activities gradually.

Now with help of well-wishers, Shanti Devi has started a small shop of simple cosmetics & daily use domestic items at outside of her house. This made Shanti to earn a bit daily and currently the couple's lives seem better.

Mr. Shadab Akhtar appreciates the initiative by COVID Care Team that enabled him to get good treatment at the Center and saved his life.

- Visit by a team from RSETI-Jamui, orientation-cum-awareness session with 45 women & youths on different trades of vocational training, the team comprised of Ms Pratibha Kumari (PM, SBI Foundation), Mr. M. K. Sinha (Director, RSETI-Jamui) and Mr. Mithilesh Kumar (Asst. Director, RSETI-Jamui). 07 youths participated in 10 days residential training on Shop keeping.
- Distribution of 10 cows among 10 farmers with 75% cost from program grant, distribution of 15 electric motor pump sets, each with a board & 2 kg wire among 15 farmers as 01 pump set for a group of 10 farmers to ensure irrigation facility to total 150 farmers.
- Construction of 01 water tank, renovation of 01 pond & 01 well.
- Covid Vaccination Camp with help of Chakai Referral Hospital. Total 137 people got vaccinated. Masks & soaps to students/youths at RCCs and CICs.



- As empowering activity for rural youths, a Cricket Tournament played among teams from all 05 operational villages, Heth Chakai cricket team was declared as overall winner.

2. Holistic Rural Development (Support: HDFC Bank)

- Supported 100 growers to produce cash crops of Ginger & Green Pea to improve their income under half acre model of Rs. 01 lac annual income of their families. Distribution of 5000 Papaya plants in villages but most of these couldn't survive due to waterlogging caused by early rainfall.

- 7 days Covid prevention awareness campaign in each village with loudspeaker, distribution of handouts & masks among villagers.
- Installation of 150 solar street lights in villages for continuous light at night time by promoting green energy.
- Ensured Child Friendly environment for 391 children (girls-180, boys-211) at 06 Anganwadi Centers through Infra development and distribution of TLM & Sports items.
- Facilitated 04 Govt. schools with Science Lab & Library, items/books provided as per demand by each school, direct benefit to 1534 (girls-861, boys-673) students.
- Provided TLM & Sporting goods to 03 Govt. schools with strength of 1044 children (girls-581, boys-463), Infrastructure repair at 01 Govt. school.

- To Ensure Agriculture productivity enhancement and HVA with integration of improved technologies, Access to irrigation, Animal husbandry, Lac cultivation and Institution building for community engagement.
- Coverage of 7347 HHs from 32 villages of Murhu and Khunti Sadar blocks in Khunti district of Jharkhand.
- Activities through Murhu Nari Shakti Kisan Producer Co. Ltd., an FPO with a capital base of Rs. 44 lakh and linked to around 4000 farmers. Total shareholders-2986, total share capital-Rs. 24,71,700, annual business is more than Rs. 03 crore 08 lakh with profit of Rs. 07 lakh plus.

4. Young India Mission Rozgar (Support: UTI Mutual Fund, Mumbai)



- A mission to link 2160 youths (18-35 years) with skill development training in different employable trades for livelihood purpose within the period of one & half year with employment or self-employment for at least 60% trainees.
- Mission Rozgar Training Centres at Hazaribagh, Koderma and Giridih district headquarters of Jharkhand.
- Well-designed 03 months practical training courses of Basic Computer Applications, General Duty/Nursing Assistance, Beautician-Menhdi-Bridal Makeup, Tailoring-Embroidery and Accountancy-Tally along with extra classes on life skills.
- The project started at the end of December'21 and could train very first batch of mentioned trades at all three MRTCs.
- Training to 360 youths (females-249, males-111), placement to 249 (females-166, males-83) or 69% trainees at various enterprises, showrooms, nursing homes, beauty parlors and Govt. projects. Some are gearing up for self-employment also.

From Confidence to Creativity

Ms. Simran Parveen hails from Kazi Mohalla locality at Hazaribagh town. Her mother Mrs. Fatima Parveen is a housewife and father Md. Ali Hasan runs a men's wear shop. The parents are of progressive ideas and support education to their all three children. Simran has an elder sister who is doing post graduation and youngest brother is in class 8th. She herself is a student of B. Com.

When Simran came to know about Mission Rozgar Training Centre and the trades it offers, she became inclined to join Basic Computer Applications course as it may be helpful for her further career planning. She has talked about this in her family and got enrolled there in January 2022. She completed BCAs successfully and appreciates overall milieu at the centre.

Apart from learning of core topics, I could improve my confidence level, body language & communicative English there, Simran says. Soon after finishing of her course, with support of Placement Wing of MRTC she has been recruited as a Computer Operator at Hazaribagh based Annapurna Cold Storage.

Currently she handles billing operations of the institution and draws a monthly salary of Rs. 7,500. Within few months only she has earned a good reputation at her work place. After graduation, I want to learn web designing to explore my creativity, Simran discloses.





4. Usha Silai School (Support: Usha International-New Delhi, SIDBI-Lucknow & Individual Donors)



- To improve socio-economic condition of rural, tribal and needy women through extensive training upon skills of tailoring, sewing machine maintenance and customer relation as well as by providing them new sewing machine, guidebook, signboard with course completion certificate to initiate Usha Silai School.
- 10 events of 85 days residential training to 258 women (tribal-180) from Nawada, Khagariya, Munger, Hazaribagh, Gumla, Simdega, West Singhbhum, Khunti, Latehar, Lohardaga, Giridih districts of Bihar-Jharkhand under Classical & Adopt segments.
- 08 days residential training to 100 women trainees (tribal-60) from Hazaribagh, Gumla, Khunti & West Singhbhum districts under the category of Usha Silai Satellite School.
- 10 days residential training to 12 Master Trainers from Hazaribagh, Patna, Gaya & Bhagalpur districts.
- Trained women started Usha Silai Schools at their places, offer tailoring training & service to village



Silai School Teacher expands her business

Mrs. Mamta Kumari (26 years) belongs to Godhiya village of Tatijhariya block in Hazaribagh district. Her husband Mr. Rajesh Rana is a small farmer-cum-carpenter. The couple has two small kids and daughter goes to a local English medium school.

In February 2021, she has been picked by NBJK staff as a trainee for 7 days residential Adopt Silai School Teachers Training activity held under Usha Silai School program by NBJK. Before that she had little knowledge about stitching but the training enabled her to be proficient on sewing machine and dexterous with garments making. Also she went to know about minor repairs if machine breaks down.

After successful completion of training, Mamta got a new sewing machine with signboard & certificate from Usha International Ltd. and started an Usha Silai School. Within the period of last one year, she has trained 15 girls on tailoring, made a number of different garments for women customers and currently her monthly income dwells in between Rs. 7,000-9,000 as an average.

On 23rd March 2022, Mamta got second sewing machine from Mr. Girija Satish (President, NBJK) who wished her success. Dr. Rakesh Sreekanth, an NRI is Mamta's adopter who sponsored her training and both sewing machines.

With help of this second sewing machine, I can enhance volume of my work as well as earnings; Mamta says and expresses sincere gratefulness

to NBJK, UIL & Dr. Sreekanth. More about

- The program could promote total 717 Usha Silai Schools and 257 Satellite Schools across 47 districts of Bihar-Jharkhand till this year.
- Facilitated total 974 rural women towards economic self-reliance with skill development and all required means to earn Rs. 5,000-10,000 monthly with dignity.

5. Poverty Reduction through Self-Help Groups (Self-sustaining)

- First time Introduced in Jharkhand by NBJK with women of Hazaribagh in the year 1991 after intense survey and study.
- Spread up to 12 blocks of Hazaribagh, Ramgarh, Ranchi, Khunti districts and 15 slums of Patna in Jharkhand-Bihar, works with men's groups also.
- Formation & promotion of women's SHGs as well as men's Joint Liability Groups/JLGs, ensures their internal saving and encourages livelihood activities by group members.
- Offers small financial support to strengthen their petty businesses with doorstep service.
- Total 730 SHGs with 16490 members, 570 loanee SHGs with 5484 members, 289 loanee JLGs with 1258 members, cumulative repayment rate 91%.
- Total 6742 borrowers, some engaged with new kinds of business like event management, beauty parlor etc.



Hold Head High

Mrs. Neelam Devi is 55 years old and lives at Kabutari Gali in Alamganj area of Patna city. Her husband's name is Mr. Pappu Prasad and they have three daughters with a son. Earlier Neelam was simply a housewife. During those days, I was quite busy with my children and family affairs, she recalls.

About a decade ago, Neelam has joined Women's Self-Help Group promoted by NBJK. Also she got training to make Aalta/Mahavar; red colour rouge applied in ankles on auspicious occasion commonly at the time of marriage and availed Rs. 8000 as her first micro credit from the organization. She started making Aalta in her home and her monthly incomes became about Rs. 5000 through this small enterprise. Soon Neelam could raise her earnings up to Rs. 10,000. This supported proper schooling of her children and marriage of elder daughter in the year 2015.

But she was not satisfied with this development and intended to keep busy her husband with something big. She continued with the SHG and began Iron Gate-Grill Fabrication Unit with her husband at nearby Balkishunganj locality. They named it as Bharat Steel Fabrication. Their hard work and business acumen resulted as more profit. Currently they keep raw material worth Rs. 05 lakh inside the shop and that rotates with returns.

In year 2017, Neelam & Pappu have married their second daughter also while third daughter & youngest son are enrolled with Graduation (Commerce) course and class XI respectively.

Now Neelam obtained a loan of Rs. 52,000 from the programme and repaying this regularly. NBJK has guided and motivated towards a new goal, which enabled me to hold head high in society. I feel grateful to NBJK and its officers, Neelam expresses.





Support to Small Initiatives



1. Capacitating and Enabling Social Activists to Reduce Poverty, to Ensure Food Security and Providing Continuous Support to Marginalized Mentally Ill People (Support: Bread for the World)



- With the objective to reinforce voluntary sector with efforts of capacity building and their involvement with the activities of poverty reduction as well as food security at grassroots.
- Supported 25 social activists and 04 VOs from Jharkhand-Bihar, improvement in their organizational capacity & program implementation effectiveness.
- Guided network activists & VOs to fulfill statutory requirements related to 12-A, 80-G, FCRA, CSR etc.

- Tailoring training to 323 women from livelihood point of view and direct support to 38 farmers for agriculture promotion.
- Sharing workshops with farmers, entrepreneurs and capacity building workshop for VOs/CSOs, participation of 180 women-men farmers, entrepreneurs & social activists from 11 districts of Jharkhand-Bihar.

(iv) more than 47% of 4600 hand to mouth families could raise their income up to Rs. 4000 monthly and nearly 34% of families have food security for 9 to 12 months

(v) proper treatment & medicines for 30000 plus Persons with Mental Illness & Epilepsy.

- Co-ordination with DSWD run One Stop Centre to support women affected by violence in private and public spaces, within the family, community and at the workplace.
- Visit by Mr. Bhushan Toppo, JSSWB-Ranchi to examine program execution on ground.
- Mr. Sanjay Kumar (Counselor) participated in 3-days Capacity Building training organized by UNICEF Jharkhand from 16 to 18 November 2021 at Ranchi. Mrs. Meera Gupta (Counselor) delivered a radio talk as "Women Atrocity & Redressal" at AIR-Hazaribagh on 30 December 2021.

2. Childline 1098 (Support: Childline Foundation, Mumbai)





- A sub-centre for nationwide 24x7 emergency toll free helpline no. 1098 to support children (0-18 years) trapped under unsafe situations.
- Coverage of over 500 villages under 76 panchayats in Chauparan, Barhi, Barkattha and Padma blocks of Hazaribagh district, works prominently across 269 villages of Chauparan block.
- Responded to 113 children under different kinds of tribulation and provided Medical Help-05, Shelter-01, Sponsorship-01, Protection from Abuse-14, Safety from Child Marriage-06, Rescue from Child Labour-03, Saved Abandoned Children-01, Safeguard from Corporal Punishment-01, Defended from Mental Torture-01, Help to Missing Children-13, and others-67 like ensured availability of Covid relief materials to children of weaker section, Counselling & social support if they lost parents and Disability certificate in case of CwDs.
- Visits by Childline City Coordinator, Members of Child Welfare Committee and District Child Protection Officer.

Suicide Averted, Girl Child Sent to Balika Grih - Hope House

Mana (imaginary name) is 13 years old girl child from a remote village in Chauparan block (Hazaribagh). She belongs to a small farmer family and lost her mother in early childhood. Her father married again and went to Mumbai as a migrant labour. He comes to home during crop seasons or at the time of festivals. Mana lived with her step mother and two younger step brothers. As time went by, she became a soft target for her new mother.

Very often Mana met misbehavior and physical torture from step mother who stopped her schooling even. Whenever father arrived home, the girl complained about such situation but he ignored, scolded and beaten her. Mana got hurt and decided to commit suicide. In the meantime, any well wisher suggested her to call 1098 for instant help and she did so. Childline Sub Centre, Chauparan swung into action immediately and a team reached to her home.

The team members met her parents and tried to counsel them with help of eminent villagers. The attempt didn't work and parents continued to blame that small girl. Eventually Childline team took Mana to police station, lodged an FIR against her parents and she was produced before CWC, Hazaribagh. The CWC took cognizance and ordered to send Mana at Govt. Girls Home-Hope House, Dhanbad. If she had stayed at home, she would have committed suicide.

3. Lok Samiti (Support: Likeminded NGOs from Jharkhand-Bihar, Action Village India, Jannalal Bajaj Foundation, Bread for the World etc)



- An apolitical-unregistered mass organization based upon Gandhian ideology, initiated by eminent freedom fighter & Sarvodaya leader Loknayak JayPrakash "JP" on 30 June 1977.
- Provides a platform for common people to break their silence over wider concern for advocacy purpose, awareness building and to influence policy makers.
- Constant activities against liquor, social evils, superstition, communal hatred and sad state of women, farmers & landless people.
- Currently around 10,000 members scattered at grassroots level to uphold democratic values with objective of people's empowerment.
- Demanded for complete Prohibition of Alcohol across entire Jharkhand and Anti-Liquor Conventions held in West Singhbhum, Dhanbad, Lohardaga, Ramgarh and Chatra districts.
- Delegations visited in various districts of Bihar where people died because of consumption of spurious liquor. LS asked for strict execution of the law.
- Opposed Agriculture Acts 2020 and made farmers aware upon drawbacks of such laws.
- Celebrated birth anniversaries of JP & Mahatma Gandhi, Lok Samiti foundation day, Organized a symposium on "Memories of Emergency: 25 June 1975", Martyrdom day of Gandhiji and Condemned Gandhi's statue breaking occurrences in East Champaran (Bihar).

Memories of Emergency 25 June 1975: A Symposium

25 June 2021, Hazaribagh: A symposium on “Memories of Emergency 25 June 1975” held at NBJK co-ordination office. Mr. Girija Satish (President, NBJK & National Lok Samiti) said that Emergency regime was a form of dictatorship which allowed arbitrary actions of the Government to torture common people. He called kindness, collective decision and honour to people's views as vital ingredients of any democratic system and to restore these values we must get rid of the prejudices related to caste, religion, race, region, language etc. Also Mr. Gautam Sagar Rana (Ex-MLA), Mr. Swarup Chand Jain (Sr. Advocate) and many journalists, teachers, political-social workers, women SHGs' leaders participated in the meeting.

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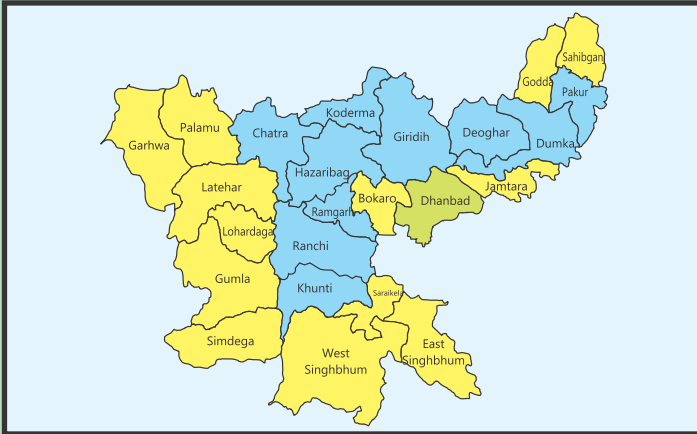

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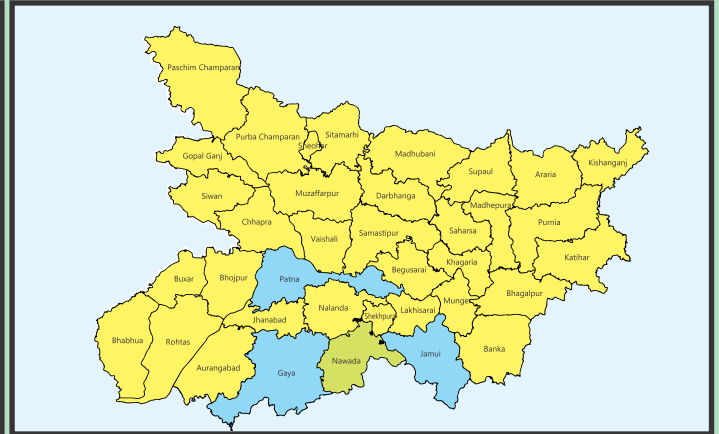
