Tata Trusts' COO Visits Operational Villages of Lakhpati Kisan™

11 May 2023, Murhu (Khunti, Jharkhand): Tata Trusts' COO, Mrs. Aparna Uppaluri, visited operational villages of the Lakhpati Kisan™ project in Murhu block, Khunti district, Jharkhand. In Chatta village, she interacted with women's self-help group (SHG) farmers who use Solar-Based Micro-Lift Irrigation systems and cultivate around 6 acres of land.

The COO showed interest in the project's implementation process and the women farmers' income enhancement from cultivating high-value crops. The farmers shared that their income now ranges from Rs. 30K - 80K per season, enabling better life choices such as child education and savings. Mrs. Uppaluri also participated in a community meeting with women leaders and project beneficiaries to discuss various agricultural prototypes and their benefits.

The women farmers highlighted integration projects on drinking water, healthcare, and their contribution to developing model villages. They have received training on menstrual health management, cancer awareness, and have access to cancer insurance and screening camps. Finally, Mrs. Uppaluri met with the Board Directors of Murhu Nari Shakti Kisan Producer Co. Ltd., the FPO promoted under the Lakhpati Kisan™ project. The visit was successful with the support of CInI-Tata Trusts team members.

NBJK-Run School Excels in CBSE Exams, Empowers Rural Girls with Remedial Coaching

15 May 2023, Hazaribagh: Surekha Prakash Bhai Public School, affiliated with CBSE and managed by NBJK, has achieved remarkable results in the recent CBSE exams for class XII and X. Aarav Raj emerged as the class XII topper with 92% marks, while Sweety Gupta and Sanni Kumar shared the top position in class X with 94% marks. The overall pass



percentage of the school stood at 96%, surpassing the state average of 89.7% for class XII and 94.4% for class X.

Principal Ms. Rina Pandey attributed this success to the dedicated efforts of the students, the guidance from teachers and parents, and NBJK's able leadership. Among 68 class XII students, 48 secured first division and in class X, out of 174 students, 105 obtained first division.

In another development, NBJK's collaboration with Action Village India in the form of Remedial Coaching Centers (RCCs) for rural girls in Hazaribagh district has yielded outstanding results. In the recent Class X board exams, 230 girls from 17 RCCs appeared, and the overall success rate was nearly 100%. A remarkable 80% of the girls achieved first division, highlighting the effectiveness of the RCCs in providing quality education in rural areas. Riya Raj from RCC-Pabra village scored the highest with 94%.

Empowering Farmers & Laborers: Highlights from the Farmer-Labor Convention in Bodhgaya

25 May 2023, Boadhgaya (Gaya, Bihar): Recently, the Kisan-Majdoor Convention took place in Bodhgaya, organized by Gaya District Lok Samiti and allied organizations. Esteemed guests included former Bihar CM Mr. Jitan Ram Manjhi and Gandhian thinker Mr. Girija Satish.

VRBEH Makes a Difference in Eye Care: May 2023 Recap

31 May 2023, Deoghar-Giridih-Jamui: During May 2023, NBJK's Vimla Ramkrishna Bajaj Eye Hospital (VRBEH)-Deoghar organized 30 eye screening events across Bengabad, Jamua, Birni, Sono, and Khaira blocks in Giridih-Jamui districts of Jharkhand & Bihar.

Through the Netra Vasant program with Sightsavers, we conducted screening camps in remote villages and provided specialized eye care at our VRBEH-associated Vision Centre in

Bengabad.

Our dedicated team also conducted door-to-door eye screenings at villages in Sono and Khaira blocks of Jamui district, identifying several cataract patients. Overall, we served 406 patients, identifying 91 cases of refractive error, 157 cataract cases, and 06 cases of pterygium. We provided follow-up services to 05 elderly patients and distributed necessary medicines to 98 individuals.
