



Celebrating 100 Years of All India Charkha Sangh

A workshop was organized on 30th July at NBJK's Ranchi office to mark the centenary of the All India Charkha Sangh, founded by Mahatma Gandhi in 1925. Held under the aegis of Sarva Seva Sangh, Sevagram (Wardha), the event was supported by Jharkhand Sarvodaya Mandal, Pradesh Lok Samiti, and Chhotanagpur Khadi Gramodyog Sangh.

The event was inaugurated by Shri Ashok Sharan (National Coordinator, Centenary Celebrations), Shri Girija Satish (President, Rashtriya Lok Samiti), Shri Abhay Kumar Choudhary (President, Chhotanagpur Khadi Gramodyog Sangh), Shri Shankar Rana (President, Jharkhand Sarvodaya Mandal), and Shri Wazir Ahmad (Vice-President, JSM).

Speakers emphasized innovation in khadi production, reduction of bureaucratic hurdles in KVIC, and financial support for weavers. The workshop saw participation from khadi institutions of Ranchi, Jamshedpur, Deoghar, Dhanbad, and Sarvodaya Mandal representatives from 10 districts.

Bankers' Orientation & Dialogue Workshop – Empowering Rural Entrepreneurs

NBJK, with support from SIDBI, held a Bankers' Orientation cum Dialogue Workshop on 29th July under its Micro Enterprise Promotion Programme at Amritnagar Coordination Office, Hazaribagh.

The workshop brought together 22 bank officials to discuss opportunities under government schemes like PMEGP, PMFME, MUDRA, and Vishwakarma Yojana for aspiring rural entrepreneurs.

Since the program's launch in October 2023, it has supported 453 entrepreneurs—including 170 from Hazaribagh—towards its goal of reaching 1,100 micro-entrepreneurs across five Jharkhand districts.



Entrepreneurs like Saurabh Jaiswal (spice unit) and Mukesh Sahu (bike service centre) shared success stories of bank-supported ventures now generating employment.

Officials from SIDBI and the District Industries Center emphasized smoother processes, timely fund disbursement, and the potential of piggery and packaged food enterprises in rural areas.

NBJK President Ms. Girija Satish thanked participants, marking the event as a step toward self-reliant rural livelihoods.

Targeted Eye Screenings Held at Child Care Institutions

Under the Inclusive Eye Health Program supported by Sightsavers India, NBJK organized an eye screening camp at the Observation Home in Hazaribagh on 20th July. A total of 67 individuals – including 59 children (one with disability) and 8 staff – underwent eye check-ups through the Mobile Medical Unit of LNJP Eye Hospital, Bahera, led by optometrists Deepak and Virendra. Four cases of refractive error were identified.

Another screening was held at the Barhi-



based Children’s Home run by Jan Jagran Kendra, where 15 children (including 10 with disabilities) were examined. One child was found with vision issues. Free spectacles will soon be provided.

Dignitaries like Ms. Nivedita (Asst. Director, Social Security) and Mr. Sanjay Prasad (District Child Protection Officer) were present.
